1	[Contract Extension - SFPark - Serco Inc.]		
2	Ordinance authorizing the Municipal Transportation Agency to extend the existing		
3	contract with Serco Inc. until June 30, 2014, by waiving the two year limitation on the		
4	exception for pilot programs to the competitive procurement requirements of Chapter		
5	21 of the San Francisco Administrative Code; and making environmental findings and		
6	findings of consistency with the General Plan.

10	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:		
11	Environmental Findings. The Planning Department has determined that the actions		
12	contemplated in this Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental Quality		
13	Act (California Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file		
14	with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 120432 and is incorporated herein by		
15	reference. The Board has considered the exemption determination by the Planning		
16	Department and the whole record before it and hereby affirms said exemption determination		
17	and adopts the determination as its own and finds that there are no substantial project		
18	changes, no substantial changes in project circumstances, and no new information of		
19	substantial importance that would change the conclusions set forth in the exemption		
20	determination by the Planning Department that the proposed project is exempt from		
21	environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act.		
22	Section 1. Findings.		
23	San Francisco Administrative Code Section 21.5 establishes a two year limit for pilot		
24	project contracts that have not been competitively procured. Any contract extension beyond		
25	the two year limit shall be subject to all applicable competitive procurement requirements.		

1 1. On June 1, 2008, the Municipal Transportation Agency entered into a two-year 2 pilot project Agreement with Serco Inc. to provide various on-street parking meter and 3 parking control projects for the SF*park* Program. The Agreement was exempt from the 4 competitive bidding requirements of Chapter 21 of the San Francisco Administrative Code 5 pursuant to Section 21.5.

On February 9, 2010, the Board of Supervisors approved uncodified Ordinance
No. 35-10 to authorize the Municipal Transportation Agency to extend the Serco Inc.
Agreement for an additional twenty-five months by waiving the two-year limit for pilot project
contracts that have not been competitively procured. This authorization expires on July 1,
2012.

The Municipal Transportation Agency is now seeking further authorization from
the Board of Supervisors to extend this Agreement until June 30, 2014, by again waiving the
two year limitation on the exception for pilot programs to the competitive procurement
requirements of Chapter 21 of the San Francisco Administrative Code.

15 4. The Serco Inc. Agreement needs to be extended until June 30, 2014, for 16 several reasons. These reasons include the fact that: (1) the Municipal Transportation 17 Agency did not receive the SF park Supplemental Agreement from CalTrans until June, 2009, 18 which resulted in the project starting behind schedule, (2) the original parking sensor vendor could not meet performance requirements for the project, (3) the technical complexity 19 20 involved in having multiple vendors supporting the project resulted in significant delays, (4) if 21 the contract terminates in June, 2012, the SFpark program will have operated for only ten 22 months which will result in insufficient data collection and evaluation to meet the 23 requirements of the Federal Highway Administration's grant funding requirements, and (5) 24 extending this Agreement will allow the Municipal Transportation Agency to prepare for and 25 execute a transition plan for a Citywide approach to parking management.
