Resolution authorizing the acceptance and expenditure of state Transportation

Development Act Article 3 funds for various pedestrian and bicycle projects in San

Francisco in FY2012-2013, totaling \$907,824 including \$453,912 for the Department of

Public Works and \$453,912 for the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency.

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WHEREAS, Article 3 of the Transportation Development Act (TDA), Public Utilities Code Section 99230 *et seq.*, authorizes the submission of claims to a regional transportation planning agency for the funding of projects exclusively for the benefit and/or use of pedestrians and bicyclists; and

WHEREAS, The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC), as the regional transportation planning agency for the San Francisco Bay region, has adopted MTC Resolution No. 875, Revised, entitled "Transportation Development Act, Article 3, Pedestrian/Bicycle Projects," which delineates procedures and criteria for submission of requests for the allocation of TDA Article 3 funds; and

WHEREAS, MTC Resolution No. 875, Revised, requires that requests for the allocation of TDA Article 3 funding be submitted as part of a single, countywide coordinated claim from each county in the San Francisco Bay region; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) and the Department of Public Works (DPW) are eligible to request allocations of TDA Article 3 funds pursuant to Sections 99233.3 and 99234 of the Public Utilities Code; and

WHEREAS, SFMTA and DPW desire to submit a request to MTC for an allocation of TDA Article 3 funds to support eligible projects that are for the exclusive benefit and/or use of pedestrians and/or bicyclists; and

Mayor Lee BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WHEREAS, The SFMTA has identified \$453,912 in work for the engineering, construction, maintenance and project management of bicycle facility projects, and bicycle safety and education projects (not to exceed 5% of the total county claim amount) in San Francisco to be funded from Fiscal Year 2012-2013 TDA Article 3 funds; and

WHEREAS, There is no legal impediment or pending or threatened litigation that might adversely affect the implementation of bicycle safety education programs or the engineering of bicycle facility projects; and

WHEREAS, The City's Planning Commission has determined that the SFMTA's actions contemplated in this Resolution are in compliance with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA, Public Resources Code Sections 21000 *et seq.*), which decision has been upheld by the Board of Supervisors; said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. <u>120479</u> and is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, The SFMTA Board of Directors adopted Resolution No. 12-047 at its April 17, 2012 meeting, authorizing the Director of Transportation of the SFMTA (or his designee) to execute documents necessary to accept and expend \$453,912 of FY 2012-2013 TDA Article 3 funds for bicycle safety outreach and education programs and bicycle facility projects; and

WHEREAS, DPW has identified \$226,956 in work for the preliminary engineering and design of curb ramps to be constructed at various locations throughout San Francisco as required by the federal Americans with Disabilities Act, to be funded from FY 2012-2013 TDA Article 3 funds; and

WHEREAS, DPW has identified \$226,956 in work to repair public sidewalks at various locations throughout San Francisco to be funded from FY 2012-2013 TDA Article 3 funds; and

WHEREAS, There is no legal impediment or pending or threatened litigation that might adversely affect DPW's projects described above, or that might impair the ability of DPW to implement the projects; and

WHEREAS, Environmental and right-of-way issues have been reviewed, and will not jeopardize DPW's ability to meet fund obligations deadlines; and

WHEREAS, The City's Planning Department has determined that DPW's actions contemplated in this Resolution are in compliance with the requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA, Public Resources Code Sections 21000 *et seq.*); said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 120479 and is incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, The SFMTA's and DPW's staffing resources are adequate to complete the projects; and

RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors authorizes the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency and the Department of Public Works to accept and expend up to \$907,824 in state TDA Article 3 funds for FY 2012-2013 for the projects described above and to execute all required documents for receipt of such funds.

## Transportation Development Act, Article 3 State Grant Funds

#### Summary

The Municipal Transportation Agency and the Department of Public Works request authorization to accept and expend \$907,826 Transportation Development Act, Article 3 (TDA 3) state funds available for County bicycle and pedestrian projects. SFMTA will use \$453,912 for bicycle education programs, as well as bicycle facility engineering, implementation and maintenance. DPW will use \$453,912 for planning and design of curb ramps, as well as sidewalk repair at various sites throughout the City.

#### Background

The TDA of 1971 earmarked ¼ percent of the general state sales tax for transit and created a Local Transportation Fund (LTF) in each county to receive the funds. The State Board of Equalization returns the general sales tax revenues to each county's Local Transportation Fund according to the sales tax collected in each county.

Article 3 of the TDA apportions 2% of the ¼ cent sales tax for the purpose of funding bicycle facility, education and safety projects as well as pedestrian, and street & road development projects. The funds are allocated by the Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) annually and disbursed under TDA Article 3 to the nine Bay Area counties. The grant does not have a matching fund requirement.

The net amount available for allocation in FY 12-13 is \$907,824 and includes MTC's FY 12-13 revenue estimate for San Francisco of \$752,527 and \$155,298 which is carried over from prior years. SFMTA and DPW will split FY 12-13 and the prior years' carryover equally.

#### **Project Selection**

#### MTA proposes to use:

• \$453,912 for the engineering, implementation, and maintenance of various bicycle facilities. The choice of projects is based on the SFMTA Capital Improvement Program and input the SFMTA received from various community groups, such as the San Francisco Bicycle Coalition and the Board of Supervisors' Bicycle Advisory Committee. Up to 5% of the total county allocation will be used for various bicycle safety programs such as educational events, safety brochures, flyers, maps, public outreach campaigns to promote safe bicycling, outdoor media and advertising, purchase and distribution of bicycle safety equipment and materials, and staff attendance at bicycle safety-related conferences and trainings.

#### DPW proposes to use:

- \$226,956 to repair public sidewalks at various locations in San Francisco. Sites for repair will be selected from DPW's list of public requests and prioritized based on condition of sidewalk, extent of damage, level of pedestrian use, accidents and complaints.
- \$226,956 for preliminary engineering (planning and design) of curb ramps at various sites throughout the City. Locations will be selected from a list developed by DPW and the Mayor's Office of Disability (MOD). The city prioritizes curb ramp locations using guidelines established under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and the City's ADA Transition Plan for curb ramps and sidewalks. The top priorities are locations that residents with disabilities have identified as ramps they need in order to safely get to transit stops, civic buildings, and to and from work. Additionally, DPW prioritizes public requests from areas with higher populations of people with disabilities and low numbers of usable curb ramps.
