4	increase fees for certain Fire Department services; and making environmental findings.

9	Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:			
10	Section 1. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in			
11	this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public			
12	Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the			
13	Board of Supervisors in File No and is incorporated herein by reference.			
14	Section 2. The San Francisco Fire Code is hereby amended by amending Section			
15	113.10, to read as follows:			
16	113.10 [For SF] Overtime fee.			
17	If a person requests an inspection or other service that requires the assigned Fire			
18	Department employee to work outside of the employee's normal working schedule, the			
19	Department will charge an overtime fee of \$ 128.00 <u>131.00 per hour. The person requesting the</u>			
20	services shall pay the fee before the inspection or other service is performed. The minimum			
21	compensation is four hours.			
22	Section 3. The San Francisco Fire Code is hereby amended by amending Section			
23	113.21, to read as follows:			
24	113. 21 [For SF] Fee-setting procedure.

1	(a) No later than a date that the Controller shall prescribe, Each year the Chief of the		
2	Department shall annually report the revenues received from each type of fee collected by the		
3	Fire Department collects., The report shall include the costs, both direct and indirect, the		
4	<u>Department incurs</u> incurred in providing the services for which each the fee is assessed, the		
5	anticipated costs for the ensuing fiscal year, the level of service the Department anticipates it will		
6	<u>provide for each service for which it charges a fee,</u> and the rate s <u>that which would be necessary to</u>		
7	support each service. such cost for each type of fee. The Chief shall file the report with the Controller		
8	not later than April 1st of each year under the provisions of the San Francisco Administrative Code.		
9	The Controller shall file the report with the Board of Supervisors no later than <u>July 1st May 15th</u>		
10	of each year. If the fees are insufficient to recover SFFD costs, or if the fee recovers more than the		
11	actual costs, the Controller shall submit legislation to the Board of Supervisors to ensure that over time		
12	the City fees do not exceed the cost of providing the service for which the City charges the fee.		
13	The amount of the license fee for the Fire Department permit for the 2011-2012 fiscal		
14	year shall be as set forth in the Business and Tax Regulations Code Section 75 et seq ., and		
15	such amount shall be reviewed annually and adjusted by the Controller commencing with the		
16	2012-2013 fiscal year.

16	punctuation, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent part of the Fire Code that are explicitly				
17	shown in this legislation as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board				
18	amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the				
19	legislation.
