Resolution extending by 18 months the prescribed time within which the Planning Commission may render its decision on a Ordinance amending the San Francisco Planning Code by: 1) adding new Sections 411A through 411A.11 to establish a new citywide Transportation Sustainability Fee; 2) amending Section 401 to add definitions reflecting these changes; and 3) making findings, including general findings, environmental findings, Section 302 findings, and findings of consistency with the General Plan and the priority policies of Planning Code Section 101.1. (Board of Supervisors File No. 120524.)

WHEREAS, On May 15, 2012, Mayor Lee, Supervisor Wiener and Supervisor Olague introduced legislation amending the San Francisco Planning Code by: 1) adding new Sections 411A through 411A.11 to establish a new citywide Transportation Sustainability Fee; 2) amending Section 401 to add definitions reflecting these changes; and 3) making findings, including general findings, environmental findings, Section 302 findings, and findings of consistency with the General Plan and the priority policies of Planning Code Section 101.1; and

WHEREAS, On or about May 23, 2012 the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors referred the proposed ordinance to the Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, The Planning Department is performing environmental review of the proposed ordinance, and estimates that such review may take approximately 18 months; and

WHEREAS, The Board, in accordance with Planning Code Section 306.4(d) may, by Resolution, extend the prescribed time within which the Planning Commission is to render its decision on proposed amendments to the Planning Code; and,

WHEREAS, Mayor Lee and Supervisors Wiener and Olague have requested additional time for the Planning Commission to review the proposed ordinance; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That by this Resolution, the Board hereby extends the prescribed time within which the Planning Commission may render its decision on the proposed Ordinance for approximately 18 additional months, until February 23, 2014.
