10	and simulated drills with the aid of genuine equipment; and,			
11	WHEREAS, Firefighting equipment, including Self Contained Breathing Apparatus			
12	(SCBA), is difficult for educational institutions to obtain; and,			
13	WHEREAS, The Fire Department recently purchased modern and state-of-the-art			
14	SCBAs, thus rendering five existing SCBAs obsolete and surplus to the needs of the			
15	Department; and,			
16	WHEREAS, The surplus SCBAs have very little financial value; and,			
17	WHEREAS, The Fire Department wishes to donate the five surplus SCBAs to the			
18	California State University Maritime Academy for educational purposes, specifically use for			
19	training in the Maritime Academy's Fire Sciences Program; and,			
20	WHEREAS, These surplus SCBAs would serve as a valuable teaching tool for donning			
21	and doffing and fire drills, and the Maritime Academy would benefit from these devices as			
22	training aids, and therefore the Maritime Academy wishes to accept the donated SCBAs; and,			
23	WHEREAS, On July 26, 2012, the Fire Commission adopted Resolution 2012-04,

8	unnecessary additions to the waste stream by maximizing the re-use and recycling of surplus
9	commodities. Disposal of surplus commodities may include sales to, exchanges with, or
10	donation to public entities, non-profit organizations, and private organizations for a public
11	purpose; and,
12	WHEREAS, In donating surplus commodities, the Administrative Code specifies that
13	the priority is to donate the commodities to non-profit organizations or schools physically
14	located in San Francisco, followed by organizations or schools located in the Bay Area. The
15	Maritime Academy is located in Vallejo, California; and,
16	WHEREAS, The Maritime Academy fulfills the criteria set in the Administrative Code for
17	donating surplus City commodities; now, therefore, be it

19	authorized to donate five surplus Self Contained Breathing Apparatus to the Maritime
20	Academy of the California State University, for use in the University's Fire Sciences Program.

The Fire Department would like to donate five (5) Self Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBAs) sets that are obsolete and surplus property to the California Maritime Academy. Per Administrative Code Section 21.03, the Purchaser has the authority to donate obsolete surplus property. It is within the best interest of the City to maximize the re-use of SFFD's obsolete surplus SCBAs to a school program that serves an important public purpose of training candidates in the techniques of shipboard firefighting.

The Maritime Academy is a program of the California State University system, in which college students are prepared for careers in the Merchant Marines or in a water-based branch of the Armed Services. Students learn navigation, ship handling, engineering and shipboard firefighting. It is that specialty skill that our Fire Department wishes to support and foster.

Recent purchases of modern, state-of-the-art SCBAs have left the Fire Department with surplus parts, harnesses, and pressurized air cylinders. These surplus SCBAs are obsolete and carry a current monetary value of no more than five hundred (\$500) dollars. They are of no practical use to the Fire Department, but they would be a valuable training resource for the Maritime Academy.

The Maritime Academy would use the donated SCBAs for training purposes, such as allowing students to practice donning and doffing of the equipment and simulating firefighting operations while encumbered by the weight of the SCBAs.

I have attached a copy of Fire Commission Resolution 2012-04, adopted on July 26, 2012, affirming the SCBAs are obsolete surplus property and donating them to Maritime Academy is within the best interest of the City.
