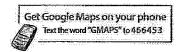
1. Sales, service, and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted only between 4:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and 4:00 p.m. and 12:00 a.m. (midnight) Friday and Saturday.

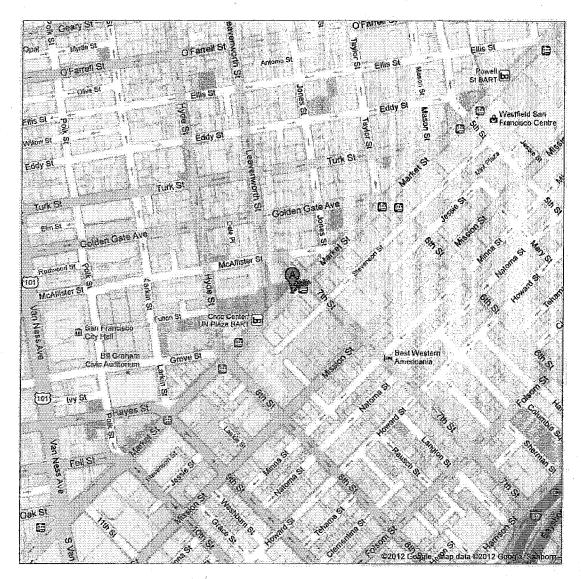
- 2. The sale and serving of alcoholic beverages shall be limited to ticketholders only during, and two hours prior to, a bona fide theater performance of the theater company. A bona fide theater performance is defined as the "licensee must actually operate a troupe of actors or other performers for the purpose of putting on a performances."
- 3. Sales, service, and consumption of alcoholic beverages shall be made only from stationary bars or portable bars and waiter/waitress service; and shall not be sold, served, or delivered to customers by individual ambulatory vendors.
- 4. The sale of alcoholic beverages for consumption off the premises is strictly prohibited.
- 5. Alcoholic beverages shall be served in containers clearly distinguishable from non-alcoholic beverage containers.
- 6. The sale of alcoholic beverages shall be limited to no more than 2 beverages per person per sale.
- 7. The petitioner shall post signs measuring no less than 12 x 12 inches with lettering no smaller than 2 inches in height that read: "No alcoholic beverages beyond this point" at all permitted exits, entrances, stairwells, and entrances to the theater seating area as depicted on the ABC 257.
- 8. An employee or security guard shall be assigned the responsibility of ensuring all alcoholic beverages remain inside the permitted area whenever the privileges of the ABC license are being exercised.
- 9. At any time the licensee(s) utilizes a third party promoter at this premises the licensee shall maintain control of the management, operation, and staffing of the business, and shall approve all marketing materials.
- 10. Loitering (loitering is defined as "to stand idly about; linger aimlessly without lawful business") is prohibited on any sidewalks or property adjacent to the licensed premises under the control of the licensee(s) as depicted on the ABC-257.
- 11. The petitioner(s) shall be responsible for maintaining free of litter the area adjacent to the premises over which they have control.
- 12. The exterior of the premises shall be equipped with lighting of sufficient power to illuminate and make easily discernible the appearance and conduct of all persons on or about the premises.

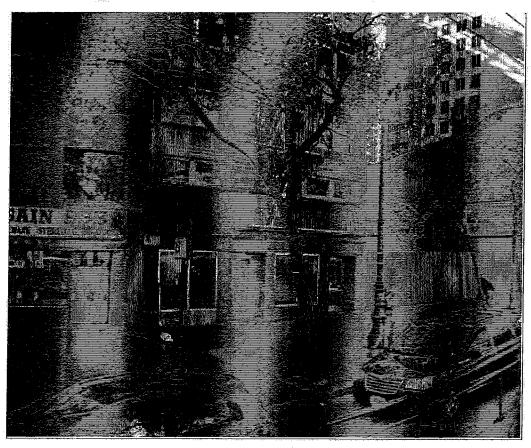

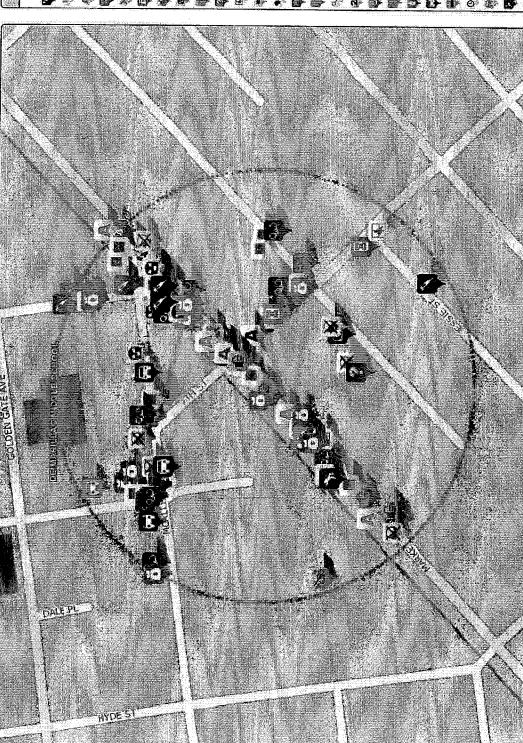

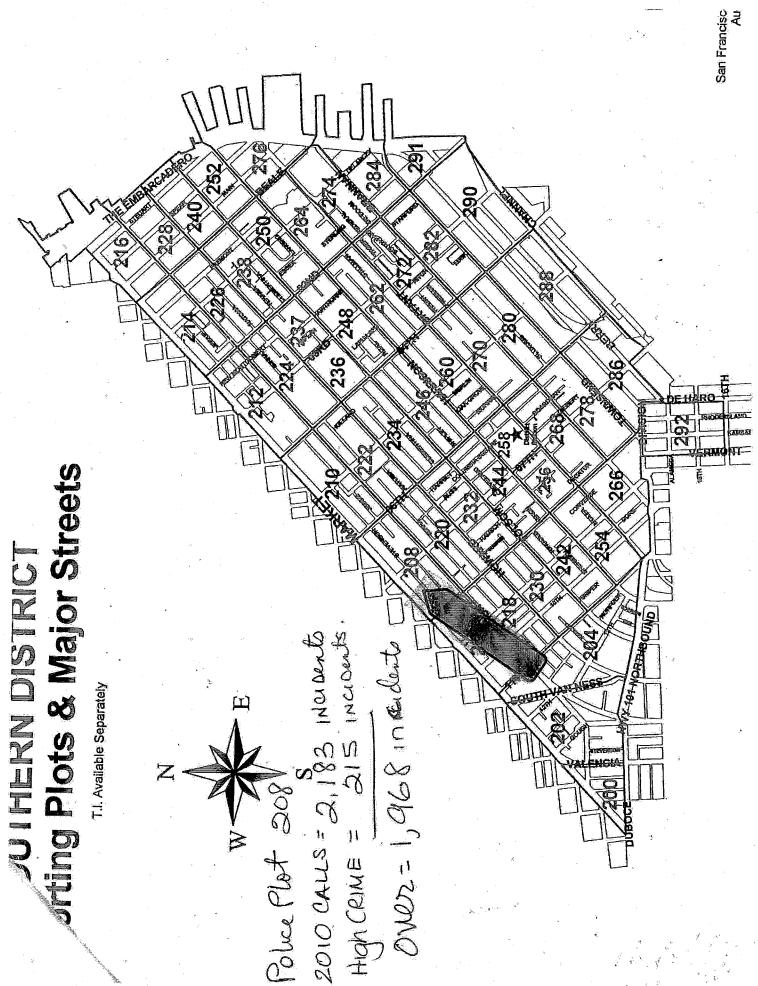

around 10pm) and periodic matinee performances at 2pm (doors open at 1pm

and close around 4pm).

### THE COSTUME SHOP AND THE FUTURE

As a component to the company's expanded community engagement initiatives, A.C.T. opened **The Costume Shop** in December of 2011 in the heart of San Francisco's Central Market neighborhood. The storefront is within A.C.T.'s actual costume shop, a space the company has leased for 13 years. The new black box theater provides A.C.T. with a stronger presence in the neighborhood, as well as a flexible stage allowing us to produce a rich variety of artistic work, from student-devised projects to interdisciplinary collaborations with local artists.

**The Costume Shop** is already providing numerous opportunities for collaboration with local arts and community organizations, through A.C.T.'s grant-supported efforts to provide free performance space to local companies who cannot afford the high cost of renting in downtown San Francisco. A few of the organizations who already have confirmed bookings for this coming season include Campo Santo, Magic Theatre, Encore Theatre (Z Space) and Singers of the Street. In addition, this multi-use space enables A.C.T. to expand all of our education and outreach programs, and, in particular, to make them ever more accessible to youth and families living in the Central Market area.

In the past year, A.C.T. has substantially enhanced its investment in the arts education and community outreach to expand educational programming to neighborhood schools with high rates of socioeconomically disadvantaged youth and English learners. Deepening the partnerships A.C.T. has already established with the schools and after-school programs that serve A.C.T.'s home neighborhood, while pursuing partnerships with organizations we have not yet connected with, we hope to engage local audiences of every age, experience level, and cultural background in the creation and appreciation of the great works of world literature that inform and shape our mutual heritage while celebrating the vibrant diversity of one of San Francisco's richest, yet most underserved, neighborhoods.

### TENDERLOIN/CENTRAL MARKET COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Since as early as 1989, A.C.T. has partnered with several Tenderloin service organizations, offering free acting workshops for children and teens through such neighborhood institutions as **Glide Memorial Church**, the **Vietnamese Youth Development Center**, and the **Boys and Girls Club**. Current programs include an ongoing, long-term residency with the **Tenderloin Boys & Girls** clubhouse, where A.C.T. teaching artists work weekly with Boys & Girls Club youth who attend the DeMarillac Academy, a parochial school dedicated to serving low-income families in the Tenderloin and other at-risk communities in San Francisco. Many of these students have also taken advantage of scholarships offered by our **Young Conservatory** for continued training.

For more than 20 years, A.C.T.'s **Pay What You Wish (PWYW)** program has been a mainstay of the repertory season at our 1,000 seat theater on Geary Street. At one performance of each main stage production, patrons are able to pay what they wish for their tickets if they donate food to the **San Francisco Food Bank**, which serves 450 local nonprofit local organizations (until four years ago, the exclusive beneficiary of PWYW was **Raphael House**, a homeless shelter for children and families located in the Tenderloin). A.C.T. has also over the years donated thousands of free tickets to constituents of **Community Access Ticket Service (CATS)**, which distributes free tickets to staff and clients of numerous Tenderloin and Central Market—based nonprofits.

Some of the organizations included in these ticket donation efforts are The Arc of San Francisco (Howard & 11th), the Boys & Girls Clubs (Jones & Golden Gate), the Center for Young Women's Development (Folsom & 4th), Central City Hospitality House (Turk & Leavenworth), Central Shih Yu-Lang YMCA (Golden Gate & Leavenworth), Compass Family Services (multiple neighborhood locations), Downtown Senior Center (O'Farrell & Jones), Episcopal Community Services of San Francisco (6<sup>th</sup> & Mission), Glide Foundation (Ellis & Taylor), Larkin Street Youth Services, Lutheran Social Services of Northern California (8th & Clementina) SafeHouse (Ellis & Hyde), St. Anthony's Foundation-Father Alfred Center (Golden Gate & Jones), St. Vincent De Paul Society-Arlington Residence (Ellis & Leavenworth), Tenderloin After-School Program (TASP), Tenderloin Health, TODCO (4th & Howard), and Youth Chance High School (Steuart & Howard). A.C.T. also frequently offers free tickets to several neighborhood nonprofit agencies (including the Tenderloin Neighborhood Development Corporation) directly. For performances of *The Scottsboro Boys* alone, A.C.T. offered **850 tickets** (valued at more than \$20,000) to community and public school groups through CATS and our own education/community outreach contact lists, bringing the powerful message of this multiple Tony Award-nominated show about a shameful period in American racial history to some of the most underserved populations of our city at no cost to them.

A.C.T. also reaches out to the local neighborhood to make connections in our artistic work, providing free community readings and discussions for plays of relevance to residents (most recently *Marcus; or The Secret of Sweet* in 2010), as well as looking to the neighborhood's richness to inspire the work itself. For example, in 2008–09, students in A.C.T.'s nationally top-ranked **Master of Fine Arts Program**, under the direction of distinguished Bay Area theater artist and activist **Joan Mankin** (San Francisco Mime Troupe), developed an original theater piece based on interviews with homeless Tenderloin residents. The fall workshop and spring performance at **Glide** were attended by a diverse array of Tenderloin residents, including the individuals whose stories formed the basis of the play.
