10	Section 1. The Pl	anning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in

- 2 *determines appropriate to the performance of the duties set forth in this Section.*
- 3 (g) Not later than May 15, the Controller shall determine whether the current fee has produced
- 4 or is projected to produce revenues sufficient to support the costs of providing the services for which
- 5 *the fee is assessed and that the fee will not produce revenue which is significantly more than the costs*
- 6 of providing the services for which the fee is assessed. The Controller shall, if necessary, adjust the fee
- 7 *upward or downward for the upcoming fiscal year as appropriate to ensure that the program recovers*

8 *the costs of operation without producing revenue which is significantly more than such costs. The*

9 *adjusted fee shall become operative on July 1.*

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the
date of passage.

Section 4. This section is uncodified. In enacting this Ordinance, the Board intends to
 amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers,

- 14 punctuation, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent part of the Administrative Code that
- are explicitly shown in this legislation as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions,
- 16 and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official
- 17 title of the legislation.
