Maria LeClair, seat 10 (residency requirement waived), succeeding herself, term expired, must be from the Department of Public Health, Nutrition Services, for an indefinite term.

Paula Jones, seat 11 (residency requirement waived), succeeding herself, term expired, must be from the Department of Public Health, Office of Food Systems, for an indefinite term.

Jessie Mandle, seat 12 (residency requirement waived), succeeding Maximilian Rocha, term expired, must be from the Department of Children, Youth and their Families, for an indefinite term.
