Jacquelyn is an innovative global leader that has successfully built and led non-profit and healthcare organizations delivering complex services that serve thousands. Jackie has founded new organizations and transformed struggling non-profits into powerhouses with high impact and financial stability for nearly 10 years. She is also a grant reviewer to the US Department of Health and Human Services.

Currently, Jackie is transforming healthcare as a senior program manager for Blue Shield of California where she works in Network Management creating and managing accountable care organizations (ACOs). An **accountable care organization** (ACO) is a healthcare organization characterized by a payment and care delivery model that seeks to tie provider reimbursements to quality metrics and reductions in the total cost of care for an assigned population of patients. A group of coordinated health care providers forms an ACO, which then provides care to a group of patients.

Formerly, Jackie was transforming training for public health professionals in California, Hawaii and the US Pacific Islands as the founding Senior Program Manager of the California Pacific Public Health Training Center at the University of California at Berkeley, CA (CALPACT). Jackie has energized the training landscape for public health professionals by using new technologies including social media, podcasts, webinars, radio broadcasts and online courses. Upon receiving a 5 year grant, Jackie created the innovative strategic plan and built an organization that uses new media to provide training to previously underserved populations of public health professionals. CALPACT clients include over 200 organizations ranging from fire departments to Kaiser Permanente to promotoras (community health workers) who receive training in Spanish through CALPACT.

Jackie was instrumental in improving hospital management practices (including reducing patient wait time by 50%) in all 13 public hospitals in Ethiopia as a Clinton Foundation Hospital Management Initiative Fellow. She worked with hospital management teams and the Ministry of Health to identify problems and implement new systems for infection control, nursing standards, hospital budgeting and sustainable financing.

In Kenya, Jackie's work reached over 68,000 people with messages promoting HIV/AIDS education as the Executive Director of Global Outreach for Addition Leadership and Learning (GOAL Project).

As a Fulbright Scholar in Indonesia, Jackie managed a local NGO that trained domestic help workers in participatory activism including the use of cameras for social change.

Jackle's interests extend beyond healthcare into entrepreneurial pursuits (currently the founder of two companies), practicing law for several years, and community involvement as a Board member of Big Brothers Big Sisters Bay Area Junior Board, co-President of the Board of Directors, Brava Theater for Women in the Arts, and a program member of Emerge California, a political candidate training program for Democratic women. She is a member of the One World Project's Committee - a organization that helps small non-profits that help children all over the world.

Jackie O. is a powerhouse in other areas of her life as well. She is a founding member of the San Francisco chapter of Ladies America. She also a member of A Band of Wives (ABOW). She is a former model and accomplished actress who has appeared in numerous plays. Jackie O. is a Big Sister with Big Brothers Big Sisters. She runs her own political blog called the Politico Princess where she discusses political issues in the bay area and beyond. She was elected a delegate from San Francisco to the Democratic National Convention in Charlotte in 2012.

I have a degree in computer science from Stanford University and have been employed at Google since 2002. I have lived in San Francisco's District 8 since 2002 and am well connected within the technology business community (Google, Twitter, Square, Jawbone, Eventbrite, etc) as well as within my neighborhood.

In my role as principal of Google's Civics team, I have worked with cities nationwide to bring best practices into product solutions that can be scaled across cities. I have engaged with San Francisco to transform their election data and transit data into standard-compliant feeds that are exposed in APIs and end-user products now used by millions. In my professional capacity, my engagement with San Francisco has spanned the Mayor's office, community groups, business organizations such as SFciti, the Board of Supervisors, and numerous city departments.

I am an active member of the Women@Google network as well as the Google Women in Engineering program. Both groups provide development opportunities for women and represent Google in the community. I am a regular speaker and have helped organize networking events.

Business and/or professional experience:

I have experience managing enterprise software implementations, multi-billion dollar audits, establishing platforms for metric measurement and reporting as well as managing public-private partnerships in the municipal space.

After Stanford I joined McKinsey as a business analyst with a focus on knowledge management and mostly worked on enterprise software. I left McKinsey in 1999 to join a startup where I was in charge of project management. In this role I helped grow the company from 20 to 200 employees by implementing business processes and solutions such as a company-wide implementation of Siebel CRM, PeopleSoft Financials, PeopleSoft HR. We IPO'd, but after the dotcom crash I decided to go to Harvard Business School to learn more about the financial side of running a company.

After graduating from Harvard, I joined Google in 2002 as a product manager. My first two years were spent guiding Google through an audit so that we could file for an IPO. My role was to document all of our existing billing and accounting practices, propose process reform where needed and eventually to work with Ernst and Young to prepare a report for the Board and for the SEC.

After Google passed an audit and went public I moved to the search team where I ran our new metrics group. Our team developed Google's first platform for crowdsourced evaluation of search results. Using this new platform we refined the metrics used to classify manual search ratings and to understand trends and strategic tradeoffs of different search algorithm changes.

I was still working on search and advertising optimization when I was at a dinner with

former mayor Gavin Newsom. I pitched him on the potential for municipal WiFi using mesh networks, but did not expect him to announce the next day that San Francisco would create the largest citywide free WiFi network ever built. This was my 20% project until it grew to encompass nearly all of my time. We held community meetings in every district and spent almost a year meeting with every stakeholder, devising partnership strategies, and eventually having our free network proposal turned away by the Board.

Since then, I have been leading Google's Access team with a goal of bringing faster broadband at lower prices to more people. We built out the largest mesh WiFi network in the country in Mountain View, CA, where we consistently have over 20,000 active users in a city of 75,000. I worked with the US Congress on the National Broadband Plan, I've worked extensively with the FCC on spectrum reform, and most recently launched a contest for cities to apply to get Gigabit speed Internet via Fiber to the Home. We have spent a year negotiating rights of way, digging trenches, planning phased deployment, battling the incumbents and we now have our first live customers in Kansas City.

In addition to my work on Access, for the past year I have been a principal on Google.org's Civic Innovation team. The Civic Innovation team is applying technical solutions to foster effective, open and innovative societies. This work has taken me into close contact with municipal governments and has inspired my interest in joining this commission.

Last year the Civic Innovation team launched a Voter Information Tool that provides an API to answer the questions: "who's on my ballot", "where is my polling location", and "what ID do I need to bring". Our voting tools were used over 115M times for the November 2012 elections. This required working with cities and counties across the nation to develop a standard for publishing this data and then coordinating an effort to have this standard adopted. Since November we have been working to expand this open data project to include standards for publishing and exposing more city data including a variety of city services such as transportation, city events, 311, and public safety.

Working on products with millions of end-users I've seen how choosing the right metrics can influence not only what is measured but also what is built. I'm confident that my experience managing large project implementations and measuring their effectiveness can be an asset to this commission in reviewing and assessing service standards and benchmarks.

Civic Activities:

I am currently a judge on the Bloomberg Mayors Challenge. We evaluated innovative project submissions from over 300 cities on criteria of vision, impact, implementation, and scalability. After three rounds of judging, we have just chosen our 5 winners to receive \$9M to start building their projects.

I am involved with Citizen Schools as an organizer and volunteer teach (2010/2011). As a volunteer teacher, I taught a 2-hour after school program once a week to eighth graders.

In 2006, I launched a partnership between Google employees and janitors to teach English as a second language. Seven years later, the program is still widely popular with over 50 janitor-students in any given class. Through my involvement in this program (I have been a tutor on and off for the past 7 years), I now know all of the daytime janitorial staff in my building. In my life, this program is one of the programs I am most proud to be a part of.

Through my role at Google I have championed a variety of civic service activities including the installation of free WiFi in a variety of cities. We now have 7 WiFi zones built, including our most recent installation in New York (Chelsea) and our flagship citywide network covering all of Mountain View.

My interest is to get more engaged with San Francisco so that we can make San Francisco a flagship WiFi city as well. To further this goal, I have recently agreed to join Mayor Lee's WiFi Advisory Group and to mentor a new Civic Innovation fellow to be working under Jay Nath.

The General Obligation Bonds are creating structures that will shape the public buildings and streets of our city for generations and I believe that I have experience and passion to help. I hope to have the chance to contribute further to San Francisco by joining this commission and helping to ensure that these very important San Francisco projects are being delivered on time, on budget, and on scope.

It is an honor to serve as the Board of Supervisor's Community Organization appointee on the Citizens General Obligation Bond Oversight Committee. Per motion M11-35, my first of two allowed terms expires on November 21, 2012. I am writing to ask your nomination for reappointment to a second term.

During my first term, I was twice elected Vice Chair unanimously by my colleagues, and have worked with the Chair to advance the oversight mission of the Committee, including:

- Assigning members as liaisons to specific projects (bonds, whistleblower, audit), to enable them
 to develop program knowledge and thus provide more effective oversight. Personally, I have
 spent numerous hours as liaison for the Earthquake Safety and Emergency Response Bond
 conducting site visits, document reviews, and project team meetings.
- Issuing the first RFQ by the Committee for bond oversight consulting contracts initially for benchmarking and improvement recommendations for community engagement and design review of capital projects and developing a target list of future audits.
- Increasing attention to the whistleblower program though hearings with the public and staff of the Controller's Office and Ethics Commission, resulting in a strengthened focus on resolving complaints on a timely basis, especially those claiming retaliation for protected activities.

I continue to fulfill the requirements of my seat. I serve on the Communications Committee for JVS.org, am a member of the Midtown Terrace Home Owners Association, and last month completed a statewide California Connections Fellowship. I regularly engage our community, including speaking to the SF Chamber of Commerce, Coalition for San Francisco Neighborhoods, and San Francisco State University.

As a homeowner and parent in District 7, it is gratifying to know I can make a positive difference in our community, and I would like to continue serving on the Citizens General Obligation Bond Oversight Committee. Board Qualifications:

The Citizens' General Obligation Bond Oversight Committee consists of a total of nine members, three of whom are appointed by the Board of Supervisors. The members appointed by the Board are comprised of the following: (1) one member shall be active in a business organization representing the business community located within the City: (2) one member shall be active in a labor organization; (3) one member shall be active in a community organization.

The other members are comprised of the following: Three members appointed by the Mayor and comprised of the following: (1) one member shall be active in a business organization representing the business community located within the City; (2) one member shall be active in a labor organization and (3) one member shall be active in a community organization. Two members are appointed by the Controller and comprised of the following: (1) one member with expertise in auditing governmental financial statements or with expertise in public finance law; (2) one member with expertise in construction management. One member is appointed by the Civil Grand Jury and shall be a member of the Civil Grand Jury or a designee appointed by the Civil Grand Jury.

No employee or official of the City shall be appointed to the committee. No vendor, contractor, or consultant of the City that performs work funded by bonds issued by the City shall be appointed to the committee.

Each member shall serve for a term of two years and for no more than two consecutive terms.

San Francisco BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

The Civil Grand Jury's purpose is to inform the public concerning the expenditure of general obligation bond proceeds. The committee shall actively review and report on the expenditure of taxpayers' money in accordance with the voters' authorization.

Reports: The Committee shall issue regular reports on the results of its activities. A report shall be issued at least once a year.

Sunset Clause: None.
