Dear Supervisors,

I regret that I cannot attend the May 2 hearing on "SFMTA's Proposed Parking Meter Expansion Plans", but offer my comments by e-mail.

1) SFMTA has made a number of predictions in the SFPark program about the benefits that parking meters bring. SFMTA must present what they have learned from the SFPark program about revenues in the NCDs and how the SFPark program has impacted the merchants. The hypothesis that the SFPark program actually improves access to an NCD, and thus increases retail revenues in the NCD, is supported by some academic research (but not tested in San Francisco). The SF data that would support or contradict that hypothesis needs to be evaluated to test SFMTA's hypothesis. If SFPark improves retail revenues, then it improves the viability of the NCDs — which we all desire.

This is critical, because if the parking meter policy hurts merchants expanding it will be bad for our neighborhoods – both residents and merchants.

Unfortunately nothing is posted on the SFPark site Benefits section (<a href="http://sfpark.org/about-the-project/benefits/">http://sfpark.org/about-the-project/benefits/</a>), and a search on "reports" or "results" draws a blank.

2) Many people (myself included) live where we do because there is available on-street parking, meaning that we do not need a garage. Imposing parking meters on residents whose purchase or rental decisions included evaluation of the on-street parking imposes significant additional costs on a small population to slightly benefit a large, ill defined population. This is not a popular action.

Any time that parking meters are introduced into a residential area, or a parking section significantly used by near-by residents (e.g. the proposed meters along the Presidio, Masonic, Euclid) SFMTA must accommodate the residents so that they do not loose parking spaces — Otherwise they will be forced to drive to work. Some program similar to the Residential Permits to permit nearby residents to occupy metered spots is essential. Removing resident parking by imposing meters is not acceptable. If the parking meters benefit merchants, then implementing meters near commercial districts might make sense — IF AND ONLY IF the needs of residents are also met.
