9	Section 1. The San Francisco Administrative Code is hereby amended by adding		
10	Section 98.2, to read as follows:		
11	SEC. 98.2. STREET DESIGN REVIEW COMMITTEE.		
12	(a) There shall be a Street Design Review Committee ("the Committee") to advise the Mayor		
13	on the design of proposed improvements to the public right of way, and to facilitate the resolution at a		
14	high administrative level of policy conflicts and project-specific conflicts in the design and engineering		
15	phase of an individual project.		
16	(b) The Committee shall consist of the following officials, or their designees:		
17	(1) The Mayor, who shall act as chair;		
18	(2) The Director of Public Works;		
19	(3) The Director of Transportation for the Municipal Transportation Agency		
20	("the MTA");		
21	(4) The Director of Planning:		
22	(5) The General Manager of the Public Utilities Commission;		
23	(6) The Director of the Department of Economic and Workforce Development: and		
24	(7) The San Francisco Fire Marshal.

- (c) The Committee shall review any proposed improvement to the public right of way submitted by a Committee member, including projects that are under the jurisdiction of the MTA, where the Committee member concludes that the proposed improvement, or a department's interpretation of or proposed modifications to the proposed improvement, may conflict with one or more of the policies referenced in subsection (d). The Committee shall provide its assessment to the Mayor, with a copy to the department proposing the improvement.
- (d) In conducting its review, the Committee shall examine whether proposed improvements are consistent with the City's Better Streets Plan. Transit First Policy, Complete Streets Policy, the Mayor's Pedestrian Strategy, the MTA Bicycle Strategy, and other relevant policy documents relating to the design of public streets, as applicable. The Committee may recommend changes to departmental standards and procedures necessary or appropriate to make those standards and procedures better conform to the City policies identified above.
- (e) To the extent feasible, the Committee shall review projects submitted under subsection (c) at the 30 percent and final design stages, and prior to any final board or commission approvals, for compliance with the policies referenced in subsection (d). The Committee, in its discretion, may review proposed improvements at other design stages.
 - (f) All City departments shall cooperate with the Committee in its operations.
- (g) The Committee shall submit a report on its activities to the Board of Supervisors twice a year. Such report shall include, at minimum, a list of projects reviewed, any conflicts between competing policies identified during the review process, and how the conflicts were resolved.
- (h) Nothing in this Section shall be construed to limit or interfere with any power or duty conferred on any officer or department under the Charter, the Municipal Code, or State law. Nothing in this Section shall be construed to require the Municipal Transportation Agency to spend money from the Municipal Transportation Fund not budgeted for that purpose by the Agency.

By:

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the date of passage.

Section 3. This section is uncodified. In enacting this Ordinance, the Board intends to amend only those words, phrases, paragraphs, subsections, sections, articles, numbers, punctuation, charts, diagrams, or any other constituent part of the Administrative Code that are explicitly shown in this legislation as additions, deletions, Board amendment additions, and Board amendment deletions in accordance with the "Note" that appears under the official title of the legislation.

REVISED LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

(5/21/2013, Substituted)

[Administrative Code – Establishing a Street Design Review Committee]

Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to establish a Street Design Review Committee.

Existing Law

Several City departments share responsibility for the design and engineering of improvements to the public right of way.

Amendments to Current Law

The proposal is an ordinance that would amend the Administrative Code to create a Street Design Review Committee. The Committee would review proposed street improvement projects for consistency with the City's Better Streets Plan, Transit First Policy, and other relevant policies, where a Committee member identified a possible conflict between the project or proposed modifications to the project and one or more of the policies.

The Committee would include: the Mayor, who would act as chair; the Director of Public Works; the Director of Transportation for the Municipal Transportation Agency; the Director of Planning; the General Manager of the Public Utilities Commission; the Director of the Department of Economic and Workforce Development; and, the City Fire Marshal.

In addition to advising the Mayor and affected departments on individual street improvement projects, the Committee would also report to the Board of Supervisors periodically on the Committee's activities.

Although one purpose of the Committee would be to encourage resolution of design issues and policy conflicts at the department head level, the Committee's role would be advisory only. The Committee could not limit or interfere with a power or duty conferred on any officer or department under the Charter, the Municipal Code, or State law.
