[Urging the San Francisco Housing Authority Commission to Move and Video Record Meetings]

Resolution urging the San Francisco Housing Authority Commission to move its meetings to City Hall, video record its meetings, and make all video recordings publicly accessible on its website.

WHEREAS, On October 16, 2012, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors unanimously adopted Resolution 378-12, on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. ______, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein, urging the San Francisco Housing Authority ("SFHA") Commission to hold its meetings at City Hall and broadcast them for greater public access; and

WHEREAS, To date the SFHA Commission continues to meet outside of City Hall and does not videotape meetings; and

WHEREAS, In February 2013, six of the seven members of the SFHA Commission resigned and the Mayor replaced those members with City Staff; and

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Housing Authority ("SFHA") is in crisis and has been declared "troubled" by the U.S. Housing and Development ("HUD"); and

WHEREAS, The HUD rating, "troubled," is the lowest classification prior to HUD placing an agency under Federal receivership; and

WHEREAS, For the last three years the SFHA has faced million dollar deficits, has no cash reserves, and is imminently expected to run out of cash; and

WHEREAS, Because of the SFHA's poor performance, San Francisco has not been able to take advantage of HUD programs like, "Moving to Work," that allow local public housing authorities flexibility in the use of Federal funds in order to institute innovative programs at housing sites to benefit residents; and

WHEREAS, The SFHA has had poor financial management leading to the current crisis including: the use of one time property sale assets to balance the budget, failure to collect delinquent rents from tenants, maintenance of a high vacancy rate of 5.1%, and absence of a Chief Financial Officer or long term financial plan; and

WHEREAS, The SFHA has lost potential revenue from HUD, including the loss of \$7.5 million, because of its failure to implement a HUD best practice requiring an asset management program in which budgets and operations would be managed by property managers at each public housing site instead of central management; and

WHEREAS, The SFHA has been failing to oversee its procurement contracts leading to potential overcharges by Recology and the San Francisco Police Department and a needlessly expensive contract with the Department of Public Works; and

WHEREAS, Until recently, the SFHA Commission has let important subcommittees lapse, including the Finance Committee; and

WHEREAS, The SFHA has no comprehensive staffing analysis; and

WHEREAS, Over at least the past four years, key senior staff at the SFHA have been in an "acting" capacity for extended periods of time, preventing the leadership and stability needed to address the ongoing program deficiencies; and

WHEREAS, Due to the SFHA's poor financial management, lack of governance and oversight, and unsound procurement practices, San Franciscans lowest income residents are suffering; and

WHEREAS, Current Housing Authority residents are living in unacceptable conditions, with a current backlog of 2,853 outstanding requests for repairs; and

WHEREAS, The current Public Housing vacancy rate of 276 units is intolerable when 26,070 families are on the waiting list for public housing; and

WHEREAS, The fact that SFHA has not updated its Section 8 waiting list since 2001 leads to unacceptable delays for the 8,974 San Francisco households on the waiting list, as the SFHA has to typically complete the intake process for 80 applicants in order to find one viable candidate that is still eligible for the Section 8 program; and

WHEREAS, The SFHA Commission currently meets outside of City Hall, meeting minutes do not offer full transcripts of Commission business, and audio recordings of meetings are not made available to the public; and

WHEREAS, Any extra cost to the SFHA to videotape and broadcast its meetings could be paid for with cost savings from better financial management and oversight over procurement contracts; and

WHEREAS, Any additional costs to videotape meetings is justified by more accessible meetings that will encourage greater public oversight of Commission business and will promote more citizen participation; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the SFHA Commission to move its meetings to City Hall; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the SFHA to video record all meetings and make those recordings available to the public on its website.
