[Supporting Assembly Bill 362 - Same Sex Couple Tax Fairness Act]

### Resolution in support of Assembly Bill 362 Same Sex Couple Tax Fairness Act.

WHEREAS, The United States was founded as a democratic nation, and our country's Declaration of Independence states that, "All men are created equal; and

WHEREAS, Due to the federal Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA), which prohibits recognition of same-sex unions, LGBT couples are denied over 1,100 benefits by the federal government; and

WHEREAS, One of the benefits denied to same-sex couples is the inability to exempt employer-sponsored health insurance for a same-sex partner and the partner's children from Federal taxes; as opposite-sex couples are able to do; and

WHEREAS, Due to the denial of this benefit, same-sex couples and same-sex headed families incur extra federal taxes on their employer-sponsored health insurance in an amount that averages \$1,069 per year for a same-sex partner and if the partner has children, the cost multiply; and

WHEREAS, A growing number of employers are recognizing this injustice and are reimbursing their LGBT employees for this unfair federal tax; and,

WHEREAS, Even when a California employer reimburses an employee for these federal taxes, same-sex couples and same-sex headed families must pay state income taxes on this reimbursement; and

WHEREAS, Studies have shown that micro-aggressions and discrimination can negatively impact the health of LGBT individuals, which makes it even more imperative that this population not be deterred from obtaining health care coverage, and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, Through the State Legislation Committee the City and County of San Francisco has officially endorsed AB 362 (Ting) which would make the reimbursement provided by a California employer to their employees in same-sex partnerships or families exempt from state taxation.

## Introduced by Assembly Member Ting (Coauthor: Assembly Member Gordon)

February 14, 2013

An act to add *and repeal* Section 17141—to of the Revenue and Taxation Code, relating to taxation, to take effect immediately, tax levy.

#### LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 362, as amended, Ting. Personal income taxes: exclusion: health insurance.

The Personal Income Tax Law imposes taxes based upon gross income, and defines gross income as all income from whatever source derived, unless specifically excluded.

This bill, until January 1, 2019, would also exclude from gross income any amount received by an employee from an employer to reimburse compensate for specified federal income taxes paid tax liability incurred by the employee.

This bill would take effect immediately as a tax levy.

Vote: majority. Appropriation: no. Fiscal committee: yes. State-mandated local program: no.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 17141 is added to the Revenue and
- 2 Taxation Code, to read:

17141. (a) Gross income shall not include any amount received by an employee from an employer to reimburse compensate for the additional federal income taxes paid tax liability incurred by the employee because, for federal income tax purposes, the same-sex spouse or domestic partner of the employee is not considered the spouse of the employee under Section 105(a) or Section 106(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, including any reimbursement of compensation for the additional federal income taxes paid tax liability incurred with respect to those amounts.

(b) This section shall remain in effect only until January 1, 2019, and as of that date is repealed.

SEC. 2. This act provides for a tax levy within the meaning of Article IV of the Constitution and shall go into immediate effect. Print Form
