- 6 to support the costs of providing the services for which each fee is assessed, and (b) the fees do not
- 7 produce revenue which is significantly more than the costs of providing the services for which each fee
- 8 *is assessed. The Controller shall, if necessary, adjust the fees upward or downward for the upcoming*
- 9 fiscal year as appropriate to ensure that the Medical Examiner's Office recovers the costs of operation
- 10 *without producing revenue that is significantly more than such costs.* The adjusted rates shall
- 11 become operative on July 1.
