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1 No later than April 15th of each year, the Medical Examiner's Office shall submit 2 its current fee schedule to the Controller, who shall apply the price index adjustment to 3 produce a new fee schedule for the following year. No later than May 15th of each year, the Controller shall file a report with the Board of 4 5 Supervisors reporting the new fee schedule and certifying that: (a) the fees produce sufficient revenue 6 to support the costs of providing the services for which each fee is assessed, and (b) the fees do not 7 produce revenue which is significantly more than the costs of providing the services for which each fee 8 is assessed. The Controller shall, if necessary, adjust the fees upward or downward for the upcoming fiscal year as appropriate to ensure that the Medical Examiner's Office recovers the costs of operation 9 without producing revenue that is significantly more than such costs. The adjusted rates shall 10 become operative on July 1. 11 12 All fees received for documents and services mentioned in this Section (c)(d) 13 shall be deposited with the Treasurer and shall be used to defray the costs incurred by the Medical Examiner in issuing such documents or providing such services. 14 15 Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days from the 16 date of passage. 17 Section 4. This section is uncodified.
