I am 66 years old. I retired as an H1 Paramedic from the San Francisco Fire Department (yes I AM applying to serve on the <i>POLICE COMMISSION</i> ) in July of 2007. with thirty-three years of street-level service in public safety. During those years I worked shoulder to shoulder with police officers, eight years in New York City and twenty-five years here in San Francisco.  In my life I have seen things as an "outsider," from the perspective of opposition to <i>The State</i> -from my upbringing as a "RED-DIAPER-BABY" thru my involvement in struggles against Jim Crow and the Vietnam and the Gulf wars to, day-in, day out, year-in, year out comradeship - actual partnership with police on the streets -as an "insider." In my early years here on the ambulance we paramedics even wore the same

uniform as the police. I did come to know the alienation and hostility endemic in some sectors of the

community -I was even shot at because I was mistaken for Police.

I have personally been involved in all the extremes that street work bring out. I have known officers who despite the "meanness" of their beats, routinely execute their duties with kindness. I have seen officers extend their sense of duty and service, literally acting heroically. I have also been immersed in the culture of bigotry that can and occasionally will occur, in the stations and in the streets. I have seen persons abused and even tortured while in custody.

In my capacity as a Union officer I represented paramedics at all levels of discipline (Department of Health, Certifying Agencies up to and including the State of California, the San Francisco Civil Service Commission and the Fire Commission) -seeking to communicate the reality of their work environment and advocating for *due process* be they dead wrong or innocent.

The amalgam of my life and professional experience gives me a unique perspective on the spectrum of responsibilities and pressures that are the day-to-day experience of officers and, on the necessities of the operations of a police force in our time. And I bring with me comprehension of this reality - that all laws are subject to subjective or worse, selective enforcement -thus the alien, the non-conformist, the dissident and the poor, bear the brunt of the occasional but inevitable fallibility of persons who find themselves tasked with enforcement.

I decided to offer my service as I meditated on stories in the media about allegations that our police have exhibited excessive behaviors at recent "OCCUPY" demonstrations. I was immediately struck by the indications that The City's response was going to be, to focus on assigning blame to individual officers rather than an examination & assessment of the culture of a department that trains officers in crowd control from the SWAT handbook.

#### **Board Qualifications:**

The Police Commission shall consist of seven members. The Rules Committee of the Board of Supervisors, or any successor committee, shall nominate three members to the commission. The Mayor shall nominate four other members to the commission, at least one of whom shall be a retired judge or an attorney with trial experience.

Each nomination shall be subject to confirmation by the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor's nominations shall be the subject of a public hearing and vote within 60 days. If the Board of Supervisors rejects the Mayor's nomination to fill the seat designated for a retired judge or attorney with trial experience the Mayor shall nominate a different person with such qualifications. If the Board of Supervisors fails to act on a mayoral nomination within 60 days of the date the nomination is transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the nominee shall be deemed confirmed.

To stagger the terms of the seven members, of the first four members nominated by the Mayor, two members shall serve two year terms and two members shall serve terms of four years; and of the three members nominated by the Rules Committee, one member shall serve a term of one year, one member shall serve a term of two years, and one member shall serve a term of three years. The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors shall designate such initial terms by lot. All subsequent appointments to the commission shall be for four-year terms.
