Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. Environmental Findings.

The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this Ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources Code Section 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 130547 and is incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. The Health Code is hereby amended by amending Section 128, to read as follows:

[Health Code - Patient Rates - FYs 2013-2014 and 2013-2015]

**SEC. 128. PATIENT RATES.** (a) The Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby determine and fix the proper reasonable amounts to be charged to persons for services furnished by the Department of Public Health as follows, which rates shall be effective for services delivered as of *July 1, 2012 July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2015*.
