Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

Section 1. The Board of Supervisors hereby finds, as required by California Code of Health and Safety Code Section 17958.5, that the following amendments to the Building Code are necessary for the specific climatic, topological, and geological reasons listed below:

All rain water in San Francisco drains to the building drains and sewers; unusual geology, occasional extremely high local rainfalls amounts, and the configuration of the City as a peninsula restrict the installation of separate storm water and sewer systems: Section 306.2.

Additional fire, structural and other protection is required due to high building density and crowded occupancy: Section 306.2.

Not a building standard; no local findings required: Section 1014.1.

Section 2. The San Francisco Plumbing Code is hereby amended by amending Section 306.2, to read as follows:

Sec. 306.2. Revise this section as follows:

306.2 Roofs, inner courts, vent shafts, light wells or similar areas having rain water drain, shall discharge directly into a building drain or building sewer, or to an approved alternate location based on approved geotechnical and engineering designs.

Section 3. The San Francisco Plumbing Code is hereby amended by amending Section 1014.1, to read as follows:

1014.1. Revise this section as follows:

1014.1 *Unless waived by When, in the judgment of* the administrative authority, and when required by the provisions of Article 4 of the San Francisco Public Works Code, waste pretreatment is required, an approved grease trap complying with the provisions of this section shall be installed in the waste line leading from sinks, drains and other fixtures or equipment in establishments such as restaurants, cafes, lunch counters, cafeterias, bars and clubs, hotels, hospitals, sanitariums, factories or school kitchens or other establishments where grease may be introduced into the drainage or sewage system in quantities that can effect line stoppage or hinder sewage treatment or private sewage disposal. A grease trap is not required for individual dwelling units or for any private living quarters. Grease traps may be otherwise required by the provisions of the San Francisco Public Works Code.
