## [Accept-Expend Federal Grant]

Resolution authorizing the Department of the Environment to accept and expend a grant in the amount of \$30,000 from the Environmental Protection Agency to develop the San Francisco Green Healthcare Working Group consisting of local healthcare professionals and to facilitate ongoing meetings to conduct hands-on training to its members on a broad range of pollution prevention and resource conservation strategies.

WHEREAS, Based upon evaluation of responses to an Environmental Protection Agency request for proposals in the area of Source Reduction, the Department of the Environment's Toxics Program was selected to be the recipient of \$30,000 in funding to develop the San Francisco Healthcare Working Group and achieve reductions in the levels of pollutants (e.g. – mercury, dioxins) entering the environment by providing hands-on support to local hospital staff to help them implement resource conservation strategies that will minimize waste and toxic chemicals; and,

WHEREAS, The healthcare industry has been shown to have significant impacts on the environment; and,

WHEREAS, Recent federal studies found that hospitals were incorrectly incinerating millions of pounds of waste that could be diverted or treated by safer methods; and,

WHEREAS, Initial surveys of local hospitals show that health care facilities are struggling with proper segregation of medical waste and have a strong need for hands-on support; and,

WHEREAS, The Department of the Environment operates one of the most progressive waste diversion programs in the country and is ideally positioned to apply its recycling and recovery knowledge to healthcare sector; and,

\*\*Department of the Environment\*\* BOARD OF SUPERVISORS WHEREAS, The Department of the Environment's Toxics Program has partnered with Kaiser Permanente, a leader in environmental stewardship in the healthcare sector, to address the challenges faced by the industry; and,

WHEREAS, The Department of the Environment will bring together key staff from local hospitals, environmental and occupational health advocates, healthcare professional organizations and consultants to create a San Francisco Healthcare Working Group; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco will facilitate bi-monthly sessions for members, that offer presentations by technical experts followed by discussions structured around implementation barriers, challenges and pollution prevention successes; and,

WHEREAS, Funding from this grant will help create and coordinate the Healthcare Working Group; and,

WHEREAS, The Department of the Environment will assign staff and resources to go beyond information sharing to address the challenges experienced by local hospitals and to ensure that information obtained will be translated into action; and,

WHEREAS, The Department of the Environment will conduct extensive outreach to local hospitals and will provide onsite training and consultation opportunities to help implement at least three pilot pollution prevention programs in interested hospitals; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco's Healthcare Working Group will serve as an important model in the region and beyond, as it will help showcase green practices adopted by local hospitals and motivate other healthcare systems in the region to adopt the same; and,

WHEREAS, The grant budget includes provision for indirect costs of \$2,727.00 now; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors authorizes the Director of the Department of the Environment to accept and expend funding in the amount of \$30,000
