WHEREAS, The severe fiscal crises that have faced California governments at all levels have severely reduced the enforcement of environmental laws by public agencies; and,

WHEREAS, The lack of enforcement of laws to protect the public health and the environment has resulted in exposure of the public to increased risk of disease and of harm to the state's natural resources; and,

WHEREAS, The federal government and 16 other states have laws that allow personal enforcement of public health and environmental laws, which has resulted in greater protection for public health and the environment than can be achieved through public enforcement alone; and.

WHEREAS, Personal enforcement allows those who are affected by pollution and other environmental injuries to protect themselves, their families, their property and resources from violation of laws intended to protect public health and the environment; and,

WHEREAS, Personal enforcement should be structured to provide the Attorney General with an exclusive opportunity for that office to enforce public health and environmental claims in the first instance, to intervene of right in all proceedings brought by private parties and to review all private settlements; and.
