[Commending Martha Knutzen for distinguished public service]

Resolution commending Martha Knutzen for distinguished public service on the San Francisco Human Rights Commission.

WHEREAS, Martha Knutzen was appointed by Mayor Willie L. Brown, Jr. to the San Francisco Human Rights Commission, and served from February 1996 until January 2004, including as Chair from February 1996 to January 1998; and

WHEREAS, Martha Knutzen was a hard-working Commissioner who dedicated herself to understanding the diversity of human rights issues presented to the Commission, who sought insight and creative ways to address these issues; and,

WHEREAS, during her tenure on the Human Rights Commission, Martha Knutzen cochaired the Commission's Lesbian Gay Bisexual Transgender (LGBT) Advisory Committee; and

WHEREAS, Martha Knutzen lent her support to the Commission's Minority/Women/Local Business Enterprise (M/W/LBE) Advisory Committee and was instrumental in the continuation of San Francisco's M/W/LBE Program; and

WHEREAS, Martha Knutzen initiated the Commission's efforts to address discrimination on the basis of weight and height, which led to the enactment of protective legislation by the San Francisco Board of Supervisors in May 2000; and

WHEREAS, Martha Knutzen spearheaded the Commission's exploration of the economic status of the LGBT Community, including chairing a public hearing which led to the development of the nation's first LGBT Neighborhood Economic Development Organization; and

WHEREAS, Martha Knutzen provided leadership on the Commission's efforts to address issues faced by Lesbian Gay Bisexual Transgender Queer and Questioning (LGBTQQ) youth, and she was instrumental in the Commission's public hearing on this subject which led to the development of the Youth Commission's initiatives on LGBTQQ youth, and later to the development of a position paper on the issue of LGBTQQ youth homelessness; and

WHEREAS, Martha Knutzen co-chaired a joint public hearing of the Human Rights

Commission and the Aging and Adult Services Commission on aging in the LGBT community,
which led to increased outreach by senior services organizations to LGBT seniors; and

WHEREAS, Martha Knutzen was an important part of San Francisco Assessor Mabel Teng's efforts to provide equality for domestic partners with respect to the taxes associated with the transfer of real property; and

WHEREAS, Martha Knutzen represented San Francisco on the United Nations' Committee on Ending Discrimination Against Women; and

WHEREAS, among the many things Martha Knutzen worked on as a Human Rights Commissioner, she actively and creatively addressed issues of violence in minority communities, environmental racism, the post-September 11, 2001 backlash against Arab and Muslim Americans, and a wide array of other human rights concerns; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco expresses its deepest appreciation for the hard work and dedication of Martha Knutzen, and for her eight years of exemplary service to the people of San Francisco; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco commends Martha Knutzen for her energy and commitment to advancing human rights for all people.
