WHEREAS, 25th Avenue is primarily (97%) a residential street with two schools for young children, two playgrounds, a synagogue, and a Chinese Community Center; and,

WHEREAS, 25th Avenue is presently a 4-lane street and since being designated a secondary arterial in the mid-1960's has been used like an expressway and an alternate route (from Park Presidio) to and from the Golden Gate Bridge and 19th Avenue; and,

WHEREAS, 25th Avenue is bearing the burden of steadily increasing auto and truck traffic and its concomitant noise and air pollution, wear and tear on the street, and actual shaking of homes; and,

WHEREAS, 25th Avenue has been the site of numerous automobile accidents and is often beset with traffic moving at 40-45 miles per hour, and occasionally cars traveling at 50 miles per hour; and,

WHEREAS, The 25th Avenue Neighborhood Association is comprised of and open to any and all residents of 25th Avenue between Fulton and El Camino Del Mar; and, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors does hereby request that The Municipal Transportation Agency and the Department of Public Works institute measures for safety, traffic calming, bicycle lanes and greening enhancement.
