[Opposing Proposition 73.]

Resolution opposing Proposition 73, otherwise known as the "Parental Notification and Child Protection Act."

WHEREAS, The Parental Notification and Child Protection Act certified for the November 8, 2005 California's Special Election Ballot will amend the California Constitution to bar abortion on an "unemanicipated minor" until 48 hours after the physician notifies the minor's parent or legal guardian, except in medical emergency or with parental waiver; and,

WHEREAS, An "unemanicpated minor" is defined as a "female under the age of 18 years who has not entered into a valid marriage and is not on active duty with the armed services of the United States and has not received a declaration of emancipation under state law;" and,

WHEREAS, Proposition 73 would restrict a women's right to make important and personal decisions about her body and health, and would jeopardize a woman's access to timely and confidential medical care and counseling; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Board of Supervisors opposes any proposed restriction of a woman's constitutional right to choose with regard to decisions about her body and health; and,

WHEREAS, we believe this proposed law puts those vulnerable teenagers - those who most need protection – in harm's way; and,

WHEREAS, This initiative would not achieve the intended goal of promoting family communication, but would instead increase the risk that a teenager dealing with an unplanned pregnancy would be delayed in getting necessary medical attention to ensure her safety and health; and,

WHEREAS, The California Nurses Association, The California Academy of Family Physicians, The California Medical Association, Planned Parenthood, NARAL Pro-Choice California, the ACLU, and many other organizations as well as millions of concerned parents all oppose Proposition 73; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco strongly opposes Proposition 73 and urges voters throughout the city and county of San Francisco to join them in Voting NO on Proposition 73; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVDED. That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors proclaims

October 2005 "Let's Talk Month" to promote family communication and real solutions for real
families in San Francisco to protect the health and wellness of San Francisco teens.
