Resolution declaring November 2005 to be "Hepatitis Screening Month" in the City and County of San Francisco.

WHEREAS, November marks Hepatitis Screening Month, dedicated to preventing and treating Hepatitis B, a viral liver disease that disproportionately affects the Asian American community; and,

WHEREAS, approximately one in 10 Asian Americans is chronically infected with the hepatitis B virus, highest among all ethnic groups and 50 times higher than the general U.S. population; and,

WHEREAS, chronic hepatitis B can lead to serious complications that are both debilitating and life-threatening, among which are cirrhosis, liver cancer and liver failure; and,

WHEREAS, not surprisingly, the rates of these complications are also higher among Asian Americans; and,

WHEREAS, despite the existence of an effective vaccine and numerous efforts in raising awareness, Asian Americans remain one of the groups most significantly affected by hepatitis B; now, therefore be it,

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors declares November 2005 to be "Hepatitis Screening Month" in the City and County of San Francisco.
