URGING THE SAN FRANCISCO EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM (SFERS),

CALIFORNIA PUBLIC EMPLOYEES RETIREMENT SYSTEM (CALPERS), AND OTHER

PUBLIC RETIREMENT SYSTEMS ACROSS THE NATION TO VOTE THEIR SHARES IN

FAVOR OF A RESOLUTION REQUIRING EXXONMOBIL TO EXPLICITLY PROHIBIT

DISCRIMINATION BASED ON SEXUAL ORIENTATION IN ITS EQUAL EMPLOYMENT

OPPORTUNITY POLICY AT THE COMPANY'S UPCOMING SHAREHOLDER ANNUAL

MEETING ON MAY 31, 2000.

WHEREAS, Companies throughout the United States have increasingly been establishing written policies explicitly prohibiting discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation in the workplace as a way of promoting fairness and equality and encouraging productivity; and

WHEREAS, Before its merger with Exxon, the Mobil Corporation, along with competitors Chevron and BP Amoco, had an explicit statement prohibiting such discrimination, while Exxon did not; and

WHEREAS, The merged ExxonMobil Corporation announced in January that it had revoked the domestic partnership benefits and sexual orientation discrimination protections that were in place at Mobil; and,

WHEREAS, As a result, the New York City Employees Retirement System (NYCERS), Trillium Asset Management and a group of individual shareholders are cosponsoring a proposal for consideration at upcoming ExxonMobil Annual Shareholder Meeting in Dallas, Texas on May 31, 2000 that would require the company to include an explicit prohibition against discrimination based on sexual orientation in its EEO policy; and,

WHEREAS, As of April 28, 2000, SFERS had 424,992 shares of ExxonMobil stock valued at \$33,016,565, giving them a significant stake in the upcoming vote; and,

WHEREAS, This resolution needs the support of public, corporate, and endowment pension funds with shares invested in ExxonMobil across the country in order to pass;

WHEREAS, Such a statement is a crucial way of that public pension funds can promote basic employee protections for lesbians and gay men; now, therefore be it,

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby urges the San Francisco Employees Retirement System, California Public Employees Retirement System, and other public retirement systems across the nation to vote their shares in favor of a resolution requiring ExxonMobil to explicitly prohibit discrimination based on sexual orientation in its Equal Employment Opportunity policy at the company's upcoming shareholder annual meeting on May 31, 2000; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to SFERS and CALPERS.
