WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the grant funds, The Richard and Rhoda Goldman Fund requires the City to enter into an agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. **000693**; and

WHEREAS, The Agreement does not contain certain provisions described below, which are required under the Administrative Code unless waived by the Board of Supervisors; and,

WHEREAS, The Department proposes to maximize use of available grant funds on program expenditures by not including indirect costs in the grant budget; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Health is hereby authorized to accept retroactively and expend the grant funds pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 10.170-1; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the grant budget; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the Agreement on behalf of the City; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Controller should be urged to designate the position created under the grant as a "G" or grant-funded position, which would terminate when the grant expires; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Department of Public

Health to enter into similar agreements with The Richard and Rhoda Goldman Fund if the grant recurs

or is renewed.; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Controller is urged to designate the position created under the grant as "G" or grant-funded position, which would terminate when the grant expires.
