WHEREAS, In 1997, the City created the Program for Assertive Community Placement (PACT) to provide a positive alternative to institutionalization or hospitalization and allow patients to remain independent and a more integral part of their own communities; and,

WHEREAS, PACT has contributed to a drop from \$24 million to \$8 million in the annual cost for treating the 400 mentally ill individuals brought most frequently to San Francisco General Hospital and is being replicated in states throughout the nation as a successful way of addressing the most serious mentally ill patients; and,

WHEREAS, Rising rents and shortage of housing in San Francisco continue to threaten this vulnerable population, underscoring the need to continue funding the three PACT projects administered in San Francisco by the Department of Public Health; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby commends the Program for Assertive Community Placement (PACT) for successfully addressing the medical and housing needs of 400 mentally ill San Franciscans every year.
