WHEREAS, Basic's food products are staples in cafeterias across the county; and,
WHEREAS, The nearly 800 employees of the Basic Vegetable Products King City plant
have been on strike since July 7, 1999; and,

WHEREAS, The strike began when Basic demanded a three-year wage freeze, a reduction in working hours to 7½ hours per day, and the contracting-out of over thirty jobs; and,
