URGING THE CALIFORNIA STATE LEGISLATURE AND GOVERNOR DAVIS TO APPROVE ASSEMBLY BILL 1819 REQUIRING THAT PEACE OFFICER ELDER ABUSE TRAINING INCLUDE THE SUBJECTS OF PHYSICAL AND PSYCHOLOGICAL ABUSE OF ELDERS AND DEPENDENT ADULTS, EXPANDING THE DEFINITION OF ELDER ABUSE AND REQUIRING THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO ESTABLISH A STATEWIDE ELDER AND DEPENDENT ABUSE AWARENESS MEDIA CAMPAIGN.

WHEREAS, Elder and dependent abuse are growing problems, both in California and nationwide; and,

WHEREAS, According to the San Francisco Commission on the Aging, a recent survey of San Franciscans over the age of 55 showed that 14,000 of those surveyed had experienced some form of abuse compared to 5,000 from a survey conducted in 1992; and,

WHEREAS, Elder and dependent abuse can take many forms including neglect, physical abuse, domestic violence, psychological abuse and financial exploitation; and,

WHEREAS, Assemblymember Kevin Shelley has introduced Assembly Bill 1819 to require that police officers are trained to detect elder and dependent abuse as part of their preparation for the job; and,

WHEREAS, AB 1819 also requires the state attorney general's office, in coordination with the Health and Human Services Agency, to develop a statewide media campaign to elevate the public's awareness and understanding of elder and dependent abuse; and,

WHEREAS, To better protect the rights of elders and dependents AB 1819 expands the definition of elder abuse mental suffering to include intentionally making false or misleading statements or

SUPERVISOR, BECERRIL, KATZ, BROWN, TENG BOARD OF SUPERVISORS deceptive acts that create fear, severe confusion or depression; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges the California State legislature and Governor Davis to approve Assembly Bill 1819 requiring that peace officer elder abuse training include the subjects of physical and psychological abuse of elders and dependent adults, expanding the definition of elder abuse and requiring the attorney general to establish a statewide elder and dependent abuse awareness media campaign; now, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to his Honor, the Mayor, with a request that he transmit copies to the delegation from San Francisco in the State legislature, as well as Governor Davis, with a request that they take all action necessary to pass Assembly Bill 1819.
