[Senate Bill 1421] URGING THE CALIFORNIA STATE LEGISLATURE AND GOVERNOR DAVIS TO APPROVE SENATE BILL 1421, ESTABLISHING A STATE EARNED INCOME TAX CREDIT. WHEREAS, The Personal Income Tax Law authorizes various credits against the taxes imposed by that law; and, WHEREAS, The California State Legislature is currently considering Senate Bill 1421, which was introduced by Senator Solis; and, WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1421 would enact a refundable state Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) equal to 15% of the federal Earned Income Tax Credit; and, WHEREAS, The state EITC would use the same eligibility criteria as the federal EITC, and would be applicable to taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 2000, and before January 1, 2005; and, WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1421 would prohibit advance payments of the state EITC; and, WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1421 would include the EITC in the list of credits that can reduce the regular tax below the tentative minimum tax for purposes of the alternative minimum tax; and, WHEREAS. Senate Bill 1421 requires the Franchise Tax Board to provide training and information to employers regarding how employees can make withholding adjustments to reflect the credit; and, WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1421 is intended to build on the federal EITC and boost the incomes of the working poor; and, WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1421 would benefit an estimated 3.8 million low-income working families with annual incomes less than \$30,000; and,

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 1421 is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. _______; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco endorses Senate Bill 1421 and urges the Legislature and Governor to approve this legislation; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be forwarded to his Honor, the Mayor, with a request that he transmit copies to the delegation from San Francisco in the State Legislature, as well as Governor Davis, with a request they take all action necessary to achieve the objectives of this resolution.
