AUTHORIZING THE DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES, THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT, AND THE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKING AND TRAFFIC, TO APPLY FOR \$1.1 MILLION FROM THE BAY AREA AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT DISTRICT'S TRANSPORTATION FUND FOR CLEAN AIR FOR VARIOUS PROJECTS TO IMPROVE AIR QUALITY IN THE SAN FRANCISCO BAY AREA, WITH THE UNDERSTANDING THAT THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SAN FRANCISCO, IF AWARDED THESE GRANTS, WOULD BE REQUIRED TO INDEMNIFY THE DISTRICT FROM CLAIMS RESULTING FROM THE CITY'S PERFORMANCE OF SAID AGREEMENTS

WHEREAS, The Transportation Fund for Clean Air (TFCA) is a regional funding source of the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (District) which supports many clean air projects developed by the City and County of San Francisco; and

WHEREAS. The District has issued a request for proposals for funding from the TFCA: WHEREAS, The Department of Administrative Services, the Department of the Environment, and the Department of Parking & Traffic intend to apply for the following projects:

- 1. Norcal Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG)Transfer Truck Project-To fund the incremental costs of 14-20 heavy duty refuse haulers in the amount of approximately \$1 million; and
- 2. DPT Bicycle Racks, \$100,000-The Department of Parking and Traffic will survey locations and purchase and install approximately 350 bike racks at various public locations throughout the City of San Francisco. DPT staff will concentrate efforts on sidewalk locations requested by cyclists, SF parks, transit hubs, and other major public attractions.

WHEREAS, The District requires that the City shall indemnify and hold harmless the Air District, its officers, employees, agents, representatives, and successors-in-interest against any and all claims, suits, or actions resulting from the performance by the City of its duties under the agreements; and

WHEREAS, The District requires that all applicants for TFCA funding must submit an "apply for" resolution from the applicant's governing board, or in this case the San Francisco Board of Supervisors;

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco project sponsors who are designated to receive funds shall subsequently submit all required additional information for Board of Supervisor's consideration of an "accept and expend" resolution; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Director of Administrative Services, the Director of the Department of the Environment, and the Director of the Department of Parking and Traffic to apply for funding not to exceed \$1.1 million from the Bay Area Air Quality Management District's Transportation Fund for Clean Air; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Director of Administrative Services and the Director of the Department of the Environment, on behalf of the Director of the Department of Parking and Traffic, to apply for funding support from the District, with the understanding that the City, if awarded these grants, shall indemnify and hold harmless the District, its officers, employees, agents, representatives, and successors-in-interest against any and all claims, suits, or actions resulting from the performance by the City of its duties under the agreements.
