An application to expand the Cafe's 48-licensed premise was filed on November 5, 2009 (File No. 100296). This license expansion should be granted because, by creating an upgraded and unique state of the art venue with a space available for private use, this space serves public convenience and necessity for community members locally and citywide.

The license should be extended to The Cafe's million-dollar additions because the expanded space meets the community's need for a setting where members of the neighborhood can celebrate significant life events. The Cafe is located in a residential neighborhood and is within 100 feet of my home. The Cafe is located on Market Street but the recently finished addition faces an almost entirely residential neighborhood on 17th Street. The Cafe failed to notify the ABC of their expansion and was shut down after neighbors filed a complaint for it to be investigated.
Over the years The Cafe has repeatedly disrupted the quiet enjoyment of my home through chronic loud music that is not contained within the yenue. In addition, drunk bar patrons constantly disrupt the neighborhood with fights, screaming, etc. Even though the owners of The Cafe recently renovated the venue supposedly with sound insulation it does not appear to be working. One of the main causes of the noise is that there are still spots in their building open to the neighborhood including the retractable roof over the patio area. While this is supposed to be closed at particular hours it often is not.
Attached is documentation of the disruptive noise that The Cafe produces. This information was obtained from Carol Bernard at the Department of Emergency Communications. The information can only be pulled for the past three years. The Cafe was under construction for a portion of that time so included are two different time periods. One list documents the complaints from 6/1/07-3/17/08. The second list documents complaints from 5/1/04-5/1/07. As you can see there are an average of 5 complaints per month. Extrapolated out over the past 17+ years it comes to over 1,000 complaints, almost all of which are due to loud music.
The Cafe is still generating many complaints to police regarding loud music and disruptive and drunk patrons. With such a poor track record complying with their conditions of use please do not allow the sale and service of alcohol in the new space.

### Attachment A

The Cafe has a history of disturbance to the neighborhood though loud music that is not contained within the premises and through raucous behaviour of patrons upon leaving the premises.

The Cafe was closed for a period of time recently for renovations. Since the time it reopened in August 2009, the number of problems have been considerably fewer than previously. This is not to say that there have not been problems. A representative of the Eureka Valley Promotion Association has monitored the operations for the past 4 months and advised the management on corrections that still needed to be made and received cooperation. In recent weeks no violations have been detected by EVPA, though immediate neighbors may have had a different experience. There is still no assurance that without regular monitoring The Cafe will not revert to its former lack of consideration for the residential neighborhood that it is immediately adjacent to.

In granting a conditional use permit for The Cafe, the Planning Commission attached a number of conditions of use designed to control noise and the behaviour of patrons. Among them was a specific prohibition against dancing in the new addition facing Seventeenth Street, which is a residential street. This was an indication that the addition was to be used quite differently from the main area of the Cafe. Management reiterated over and over that the purpose of the addition was to provide a place for a pool table. It was stated that there would be no bar in the addition. As one of the people involved in negotiations with The Cafe, I had the distinct expectation that the addition absolutely would not be an expansion of the bar and I believe that I was reassured on that point. To my mind that meant that there would be no alcohol served there, though I expected that patrons would not be prohibited from carrying their glasses to the area when taking a break from the noisier atmosphere of the main part of the Cafe. This is important because this addition faces on Seventeenth Street, not Market Street, and should definitely not be an extension of the bar area.

Therefore, I protest the issuance of a license to the Cafe for the purpose of serving alcohol in the addition that faces Seventeenth Street.
