Resolution Commemorating the 8th Annual Transgender Day of Remembrance and to celebrate the diversity in people's self-defined gender identities and expressions.

WHEREAS, The Transgender Day of Remembrance is held every November in honor of Rita Hester, a trans-woman who was murdered on the night of November 28, 1998 and who died of multiple stab wounds; and,

WHEREAS, Rita Hester's murder remains unsolved like many anti-transgender murder cases and has caused the creation of "Remembering Our Dead," a project dedicated to memorializing those persons killed because of anti-transgender hatred and prejudice; and,

WHEREAS, The first "Day of Remembrance" event was held as a candlelight vigil in San Francisco in 1999; and,

WHEREAS, Since then, events have been organized in numerous cities in the United States as well as in various countries around the world on November 20 every year; and,

WHEREAS, Over the last decade, more than one person per month has died from transgender-based hate or prejudice and this trend shows no sign of abating; and,

WHEREAS, This year's remembrance memorializes those reported killings from 2005 to the present including Rani, Vanessa Facen, Simone Walton, Roberta Oliveira, Paulina (Juan Pablo Mzndez Cartagena), Alexis L. King, Tiffany Berry, Yardena Marsh, Gisberta Salce Junior, Melissa "Mo" Green, Rupesh Mandal, Alfred Dibble, Sudha (aka, Lakshmi), Barbara (Geovanny) Calderon, Lupita (Juan Carlos Charria), Lezlie Anne Field, Mikey Vallejo-Seiber, Edgar Cano Camacho; and,
