Resolution Requesting the Amendment of the Metropolitan Transportation Commission Act to Provide for the Appointee of the Mayor to Serve at the Pleasure of the Mayor.

WHEREAS the California Legislature established the Metropolitan Transportation

Commission to provide comprehensive regional transportation planning for the Bay Area and
to control the disbursement of Federal and State funds to support projects specified in its plan;
and

WHEREAS the Commission consists of nineteen members appointed to four year terms by various governmental agencies in the Bay Area; and

WHEREAS the City and County of San Francisco is allotted two members, one appointed by the Board of Supervisors and one appointed by the Mayor; and

WHEREAS the appointee of the Mayor does not serve at the pleasure of the Mayor but for a term of four years and cannot be removed from office; and

WHEREAS the appointee of the Mayor is therefore not accountable to the Mayor and the various City agencies involved with transportation, and may not adequately looked after their interests and as a result may disadvantage the City and County of San Francisco; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors deems it important and necessary to correct this disadvantageous condition by requesting the California Legislature to amend the Metropolitan Transportation Commission Act (California Government Code Section 66500-66536.1) Section 66504 as follows:

66504. Each commissioner's term of office is four years. A commissioner appointed as a public officer vacates his commission seat upon ceasing to hold such public office

unless the appointing authority consents to completion of the term of office. The commissioner appointed by the Mayor of San Francisco shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor.
