DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO ESTABLISH A

PROPERTY AND BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT TO BE KNOWN AS THE "UNION SQUARE BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT," TO ORDER THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF A MULTI-YEAR ASSESSMENT, AND SETTING A TIME AND PLACE FOR A PUBLIC HEARING THEREON.

WHEREAS, Whereas Proposition 218 was adopted on November 6, 1996, adding Articles XIIIC and XIIID to the California Constitution; and,

WHEREAS, Articles XIIIC and XIIID of the California Constitution impose certain procedural and substantive requirements relating to assessments (as defined); and,

WHEREAS, The Property and Business Improvement Law of 1994 (California Streets and Highways Code Sections 36600 et seq.) authorizes cities to establish property and business improvement districts for the purpose of levying assessments on real property for certain purposes; and,

WHEREAS, A petition has been filed by property owners who will pay more than 50 percent of the total amount of assessments to be levied, requesting the Board of Supervisors to establish such a district to be named the Union Square Business Improvement District; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors declares as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to Sections 36600 et seq. of the California Streets and Highways Code ("the Act"), the Board of Supervisors declares its intent to consider the establishment of a property and business improvement district to be named the Union Square Business Improvement District ("the District"), and to order the levy and collection of assessments for the next five fiscal years beginning July 1, 1999 and ending June 30, 2004, for the costs and incidental expenses of establishing and maintaining the District that have

The time and manner of collecting the assessment:

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- (h) The specific number of years in which assessments will be levied;
- (i) The proposed time for implementation and completion of the management district plan;
 - (j) Any proposed rules and regulations to be applicable to the district;
- (k) A list, by assessor's parcel number, of the properties to be benefited, and a statement of the method or methods by which the expenses of the district will be imposed upon benefited real property, in proportion to the benefit received by the property, to defray the cost thereof, including operation and maintenance.
- Section 3. The Board of Supervisors hereby approves the form of the Notice of Public Hearing and Assessment Ballot which are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 981845

Section 4. Within the area encompassed by the proposed district, the City currently provides services at the same level provided to other similar areas of the City. It is the intent of the Board of Supervisors to continue to provide the area encompassed by the proposed district with the same level of services provided to these other similar areas of the City. The formation of the district will not affect the City's policy to continue to provide the same level of service to the areas encompassed by the district as it provides to other similar areas of the City during the duration of the district.

Section 5. A public hearing on the establishment of the proposed district shall be conducted before the Board of Supervisors on January 25, 1999 at 3 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the matter may be heard, in the Board's Legislative Chambers, Second Floor, City Hall, 1 Dr. Carlton Goodlett Place, San Francisco, California, 94102. At this hearing, the Board of Supervisors will hear testimony regarding the proposed district, including testimony from all interested persons for or against establishment of the District, the extent of the District, and the furnishing of specific types of service, improvements or activities. The Board

of Supervisors may waive any irregularity in the form or content of any written protest, and at the public hearing may correct minor defects in the proceedings. All protests submitted by affected property owners and received prior to the conclusion of this public hearing shall be tabulated to determine whether a majority protest exists.

Section 6. The Clerk of the Board is directed to give notice of the public hearing as provided in Section 53753 of the Government Code, Section 4 of Article XIIID of the California Constitution, Section 16.112 of the San Francisco Charter and Section 67.7-1 of the San Francisco Administrative Code.
