URGING UCSF TO USE ALTERNATIVE RESEARCH METHODS INSTEAD OF ANIMAL TESTING WHEN AVAILABLE, BUILD AAALAC ACCREDITED FACILITIES AT THEIR PARNASSUS AND MISSION BAY CAMPUSES, AND APPLY HUMANE STANDARDS TO THE SQUIRREL MONKEY EXPERIMENT.

WHEREAS, Researching animals has been responsible for some of the most important advances in human and animal health, including heart surgery, improvements in the survival of new born infants, and the treatment of AIDS, diabetes, breast and other cancers; and

WHEREAS, Many of the most important questions related to human health can still only be answered by research using animals; and

WHEREAS, Technology is being developed and encouraged that offers an alternative to animal research, including the use of computer models, cell and tissue cultures, gene-splicing techniques, and recombinant DNA technology; and

WHEREAS, Although there are philosophical difference between animal rights activists and medical researchers about the use of animals for research, there is agreement that animals must be treated humanely and with the highest level of compassionate care; and

WHEREAS, Practicing good animal care requires comprehensive training in techniques, procedures, regulations, and ethics; and

WHEREAS, The University of California at San Francisco's (UCSF) animal care facility at Parnassus Heights was built 58 years ago; and

WHEREAS, UCSF cannot achieve certification for their Parnassus facility from the Association For Assessment and Accreditation of Laboratory Animal Care (AAALAC) because of the age of the facility; and

WHEREAS, UCSF is planning to build facilities at Mission Bay that will include animal care facilities; and

WHEREAS, UCSF has been cited by the US Department of Agriculture for animal care violations; and

WHEREAS, In addition to these violations, an experiment is being conducted that subjects anesthetized squirrel monkeys to significant noise to induce hearing disability; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco hereby urges UCSF not to use animal testing unless absolutely necessary, only to use animals for testing when scientific merit has been demonstrated, and to use alternative research methods when available; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That UCSF provide the most comprehensive training in the use of animals for research; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That UCSF build new animal care facilities with the highest state of the art standards, both at Mission Bay and their Parnassus campus and achieve AAALAC certification when the new facilities are built; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That UCSF will correct violations cited by the USDA in their animal care facilities as quickly as possible; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That The Board of Supervisors urges UCSF to apply the above standards to the squirrel monkey experiment.
