WHEREAS, There are now 167 gay choruses worldwide and a Gay and Lesbian Chorus Association (GALA), that hosts leadership forums and chorus festivals to support the exploding growth of the gay choral movement; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus has made outstanding musical and cultural contributions to the City of San Francisco through its ability to sing as one instrument with tremendous clarity and diction; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby extends its highest commendation to the San Francisco Gay Men's Chorus as it celebrates its twentieth year of outstanding contributions to the world of choral music.
