[Oppose Quincy Logging Bill]

OPPOSING S 1028, THE QUINCY LIBRARY LOGGING BILL, AND ASKING THAT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION BE SENT TO OUR FEDERAL REPRESENTATIVES IN THE U.S. SENATE.

WHEREAS, The Quincy Library Group Forest Recovery and Economic Stability Act of 1997 would establish a pilot project timber management plan for 2.5 million acres of public land, including Plumas National Forest, the Lassen National Forest and the Sierraville Range of the Tahoe National Forest; and,

WHEREAS, This plan has been referred to as an experimental fire-control program, which could lead to 300,000 acres of "fuel breaks" - thinning forests along roads to slow forest fires; and,

WHEREAS, The Forest Service estimates that the additional logging requiring over 100 miles of new road construction will increase the level of watershed disturbance on the affected public forests by up to 300% over current management in an area that produces drinking water for millions throughout the state; and,

WHEREAS. The Congressional Budget Office reported that implementation of this legislation would cost federal taxpayers \$70 million, with future costs potentially exceeding \$1.8 million annually, forcing reallocation of funds from other national forests affecting plans to build trails and campgrounds serving San Francisco; and,

WHEREAS, Over 140 conservation organizations oppose this legislation, including the Sierra Club, the Wilderness Society, National Resources Defense Council, Friends of the River and California Wilderness Coalition; and,

WHEREAS, The Quincy bill increases logging on public forest lands in the northern Sierra Nevada, resulting in timber harvest volumes of about 165 million board feet (from 113 in FY98) in the first year and about 250 million in the subsequent years, a 121% increase; and,
