[Ocean Beach Safety Efforts]

URGING THE GOLDEN GATE NATIONAL RECREATION AREA TO TAKE SAFETY
MEASURES, INCLUDING CREATING A LIFEGUARD STATION, TO PREVENT WATER
ACCIDENTS AND FATALITIES AT OCEAN BEACH.

WHEREAS, An estimated 2 million people visit Ocean Beach each year, sometimes as many as 10,000 in a single day; and,

WHEREAS, This beach suffers from killer rip currents, each between 50 feet and 50 yards wide, identified by their choppy surface and dirty brown color, making it the most perilous beach in California and the deadliest beach in the U.S.; and,

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco is particularly concerned by the fact that 7 persons have drowned in the past year at Ocean Beach, accounting for 10% of all unguarded beach fatalities in the country; and,

WHEREAS, If a surfer is not close enough to rescue someone caught in a rip current, it is often too late by the time the San Francisco Fire Department and National Park rangers can respond to a cell phone call; and,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors' Parks and Recreation Committee held a widely attended hearing to discuss signage policies and other recommended safety measures for Ocean Beach on September 17; and,

WHEREAS, Attendees of this hearing included representatives from the Golden Gate National Recreation Area, as well as representatives from the United States Lifesaving Association; and,

WHEREAS, The Golden Gate National Recreation Area, responsible for oversight of this beach, has increased safety efforts by placing additional lifesaving and outreach personnel to patrol the beach; and,

WHEREAS, The Park Service has also placed more signs along the beach to warn visitors of the dangerous undercurrents, including international symbol signage; and,

WHEREAS, San Diego, Los Angeles, and Stinson Beaches have lifeguards, yet Ocean Beach does not; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors does hereby urge the Golden Gate National Recreation area to take the following steps in addressing safety concerns at Ocean Beach:

- Investigate the possibility of installing an elevated observation post tower at the Cliff House
 or the Beach Chalet, which would serve as a command center that could quickly dispatch
 trained lifeguards to the scene without providing visibility that might indicate that
 swimming is endorsed at this beach; and
- Request an appropriation specific to Ocean Beach to provide regular

 2. Make permanent the added beach patrol personnel in policy and in funding, even if only beach patrols to address this ongoing hazard seasonal, for consistent attention to this ongoing danger; and,

Acquire a water rescue vehicle to be stationed at Ocean Beach, and install 3. Install a launching platform for emergency water rescue craft, such as a jet ski or hovercraft; a launching platform to facilitate emergency water rescues and.

- 4. Continue its efforts to provide materials and signage in various languages, including international symbols; and,
- 5. Make warning signs permanent, elevated to eye level; and,
- 6. Use due diligence in enlisting culturally competent outreach workers to approach the diverse range of beach visitors; and,
- 7. Exhaust all possible resources in installing telephones or call boxes along the parking lot and/or along the highway at Ocean Beach, including applying for state funding to do so; and,
- 8. Work with City agencies, particularly MUNI and the Airport in disseminating information about Ocean dangers; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board does hereby urge the Golden Gate National Recreation Area to provide the Board with a progress report, asking for additional assistance as necessary to accomplish these goals; and, be it
