WHEREAS, Walden House provides counseling, treatment, and educational services to adolescents and young adults in residential settings; and,

WHEREAS, Many of the young women who receive services from Walden House are victims of physical and emotional abuse; and,

WHEREAS, Treatment success rates have tripled since Walden House established separate gender-specific residential treatment programs; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Unified School District has provided teachers for separate gender-specific classes in the past; and,

WHEREAS, Walden House provides an on-site principal, administrative personnel, counselors, and therapists for students; and,

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Unified School District has informed Walden House that there is an insufficient number of students to justify teachers for separate classes for both the Young Women's Program and the Young Men's Program; and,

WHEREAS, Walden House anticipates an increase in enrollment within the next month; now, therefore, be it,

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the San Francisco Unified School District to provide teachers for both the Walden House Young Women's Program and the Young Men's Program.
