WHEREAS, San Franciscans of Greek ancestry form the largest and most viable Greek colony west of the Mississippi River; and,

WHEREAS, The creation and siting of a commemorative plaque in the South of Market Area, that neighborhood which became the center Greek settlement, would be an appropriate way to honor that community's contributions; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Department of Public Works take all appropriate steps to ensure that a plaque commemorating San Francisco's Greek community is created and sited in an appropriate place within the South of Market district; and be it
