SUPPORTING THE NOMINATION OF JAMES HORMEL AS AMBASSADOR TO

LUXEMBOURG AND URGING THE UNITED STATES SENATE LEADERSHIP TO ACT ON HIS NOMINATION.

WHEREAS, On October 6, 1997 the President of the United States nominated San Francisco citizen James Hormel to the post of Ambassador to Luxembourg; and,

WHEREAS, The nomination of James Hormel has languished in the United States Senate for almost one year and has been prevented by the personal prejudices of the Senate leadership from coming to a vote before the entire Senate; and,

WHEREAS, The majority of United States Senators, including California Senators Boxer and Feinstein express their support for James Hormel's nomination and express their disgust with the denial of the democratic process which would allow for the Senate to vote on the nomination; and

WHEREAS. The government of Luxembourg confirmed their acceptance of James Hormel as Ambassador to their nation; and,

WHEREAS, The sole reason the Senate leadership refuses to bring the nomination to the Senate for a vote is the sexual orientation of James Hormel; and.

WHEREAS, Mr. Hormel's employment qualifications include service as an Alternate Representative of the U.S. Delegation to the 51st Session of the United Nations Human Rights Commission; and,

WHEREAS, Over 70% of the citizens of the United States have repeatedly confirmed in multiple polls that they disapprove of employment discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation; and,

WHEREAS, Twenty-four Republican and forty-one Democrat Senators have indicated in writing that sexual orientation is not a consideration for them in the hiring, promoting, or terminating of an employee in their own offices; and,

WHEREAS, The Senate Foreign Relations Committee, under the Chairmanship of Senator Jesse Helms, has overwhelmingly recommended the nomination be passed to the full Senate for its consideration; and,

WHEREAS, The radical right wing and religious political extremists have maliciously lied, misrepresented and defamed San Francisco, its citizens, and James Hormel in an attempt to block Mr. Hormel's confirmation as Ambassador to Luxembourg; and,

WHEREAS, James Hormel has proven himself to be a magnanimous philanthropist for the City and County of San Francisco, providing and promoting education, health, art, and culture for all San Franciscans; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors confirms its support for the nomination of James Hormel as Ambassador to Luxembourg; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the United States Senate leadership to allow the nomination to come to a vote; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Mayor forward a copy of this legislation to the United States Senate Majority Leader, Senator Trent Lott, with a request that the nomination of James Hormel go to a vote.
