ESTABLISHING AN ADVISORY TASK FORCE TO EVALUATE THE IMPACT AND BENEFITS OF LIVING WAGE PROPOSALS ON SAN FRANCISCO'S ECONOMY, BUSINESSES, NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS AND RESIDENTS AND SETTING FORTH THE MEMBERSHIP AND DUTIES OF THE TASK FORCE.

WHEREAS, A number of cities have recently adopted or are considering ordinances mandating minimum wage and benefits levels for private sector employees; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco can benefit greatly from the participation and expertise of members of the public, businesses, non-profit organizations, labor unions, low wage earners and other groups potentially affected by any minimum wage or "living wage" proposal; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby creates an advisory task force, called the Living Wage Task Force, to evaluate the impact and benefits of living wage proposals on San Francisco's economy, businesses, non-profit organizations and residents; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Living Wage Task Force shall aid the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor in reviewing various proposals, legislation and studies of the impact and benefits of a "living wage" ordinance; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board shall refer any "living wage" proposals, studies and relevant reports to the Task Force for consideration and input before voting on any legislation creating a "Living Wage"; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall study, discuss and provide comments on "living wage" legislative proposals, supporting research and analysis, and related issues they deem appropriate and subsequently communicate to the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors their findings and recommendations regarding such proposals; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That Task Force members shall be prepared to testify before the Board of Supervisors, if so requested, on "living wage" issues and legislation; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Living Wage Task Force shall be comprised of 15 members, appointed in the following manner:

- -- One (1) by each of the eleven members of the Board of Supervisors,
- -- Four (4) by the entire Board of Supervisors, as follows:
 - --One (1) representative of small, medium or large businesses that contract with the City;
 - --One (1) representative of low-income workers from non-profits or businesses that contract with the City;
 - --One (1) representative of non-profit organizations that contract with the City;

--One (1) representative of organized labor;

and these eleven individual appointments by Board members shall be made from those individuals who represent small and large businesses, non-profit and other organizations that contract with the City, labor and other communities potentially affected by the passage of a "living wage ordinance;" and be it FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall be open, public and diverse;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the members shall appoint a Chair to convene and run meetings and to work with city staff to ensure that meetings are properly noticed and Board is informed of Task Force actions; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That meetings of the Living Wage Task Force shall be open to the public and comply with San Francisco's Sunshine Ordinance; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Office of the City Administrator shall provide staff support for the Task Force; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Living Wage Task Force shall expire within 6 months of approval of this resolution.
