ENCOURAGING BRISBANE RECYCLING COMPANY INCORPORATED TO IMMEDIATELY CEASE AND DESIST FROM FURTHER VIOLATION OF IT'S EMPLOYEE'S RIGHTS AND FURTHER URGING BRISBANE RECYCLING TO REINSTATE WITH BACK PAY, WORKERS THAT HAD BEEN WRONGFULLY TERMINATED AS WELL AS TO HONOR ITS EMPLOYEES WISHES TO IMMEDIATELY COMMENCE NEGOTIATIONS WITH OPERATING ENGINEERS LOCAL 3.

WHEREAS, Brisbane Recycling Company Incorporated (BRCI), has conducted business with the City and County of San Francisco for a number of years; and WHEREAS, BRCI hires Latino immigrant workers almost exclusively; and WHEREAS, 85% of these workers have voluntarily joined Operating Engineers Local 3; and

WHEREAS, These workers have publicly requested to negotiate with the BRCI management; and

WHEREAS, The National Labor Relations Board is currently investigating BRCI for illegal termination of its employees and threatening union organizers with violence and arrest; and

WHEREAS, Latino employees of BRCI have formally presented complaints of unsafe and hazardous conditions to BRCI management; and

WHEREAS, It is the policy of the City and County of San Francisco that all workers, regardless of race, religion, country of origin, gender or sexual orientation, shall have the right to freely organize and join a union free intimidation, retaliation or violence; and

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco recognizes the valuable economic, and cultural contributions that Latino workers have made to San Francisco and the state of California for the past century and often under harsh social conditions and adverse political climate; and

WHEREAS, It is the desire of the City and County to reconsider further contract agreements with BRCI until allegations of violation of fundamental rights of workers to organize have been resolved; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco strongly encourages Brisbane Recycling Company Incorporated to immediately cease and desist from further violation of it's employee's rights; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors further urges BRCI to reinstate with back pay, workers that had been wrongfully terminated; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors urges BRCI to honor its employees wishes and immediately commence negotiations with Operating Engineers Local 3; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, The Board of Supervisors further request that the Clerk of Board send copies of this resolution to the management of Brisbane Recycling Company Incorporated as well as to Operating Engineers Local 3.
