APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING A LAND DONATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY AND COUNTY AND THE REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, FOR THE CONTRIBUTION TO THE REGENTS, AT NO TRANSFER PRICE, OF APPROXIMATELY 11.89 ACRES OF CITY-OWNED PRESENT AND FORMER STREET AREAS, FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A NEW UCSF EXPANSION CAMPUS IN MISSION BAY SOUTH: ADOPTING FINDINGS PURSUANT TO THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL

QUALITY ACT; AND ADOPTING FINDINGS THAT THE CONVEYANCE IS CONSISTENT WITH THE CITY'S GENERAL PLAN AND EIGHT PRIORITY POLICIES OF CITY PLANNING CODE SECTION 101.1.

WHEREAS, In January 1997, The Regents of the University of California ("The Regents") approved the 1996 Long Range Development Plan ("LRDP") for the University of California, San Francisco ("UCSF"), and the LRDP identified three finalist locations for a new expansion campus for UCSF, including a location in Mission Bay and two other locations outside of the City and County; and,

WHEREAS, In May 1997, The Regents approved Mission Bay South as the location for the new campus (the "UCSF Campus"); and,

WHEREAS, The property owners of the Mission Bay site selected by The Regents for the UCSF Campus are Catellus Development Corporation ("Catellus") and the City; and,

WHEREAS, As an essential condition to The Regent's agreement to select the Mission Bay site, Catellus and the City offered to contribute to The Regents a total of approximately 43 acres of land in Mission Bay South for development of the UCSF Campus (the "Campus Site"); and,

WHEREAS, At full build out, the UCSF Campus will include approximately 2.650.000 square feet of instruction, research and administration space, plus associated parking and

loading uses, to house UCSF's world-renowned faculty and research facilities; and.

WHEREAS, The retention within the City of UCSF, which is one of the City's major employers, and development of the new UCSF Campus affords numerous public benefits to the City and County and its residents, including, but not limited to, the advancement of public education and medical research, the creation of jobs, and the promotion of the City's growing biotechnology industry in the area surrounding the new campus; and,

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Resolution Nos. 185-98 and 186-98, the Board of Supervisors has approved the donation by the City, including its Port Commission (the "Port"), to The Regents of approximately 1.34 acres of land to enable The Regents to expand UCSF's facilities on an approximately 4.98-acre site known as block 24, which is comprised of the City street areas and certain adjoining land to be contributed by Catellus to The Regents; and,

WHEREAS, The City and County owns approximately 11.89 acres of additional land within the Campus Site, which land consists of portions of former and current streets and is more particularly described in the maps and legal descriptions on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 98-1435 (the "City Donation Property"); and,

WHEREAS, Pursuant to companion Resolution No. \_\_332-98 \_\_\_\_ and Section 1 of Chapter 1143 of the Statutes of 1991 of the State of California, as amended by Chapter 86 of the Statutes of 1992 and by Chapter 203 of the Statutes of 1997, the City intends to enter into an Amended and Restated Agreement Concerning the Public Trust with Catellus and the State of California (the "Amended ACPT"), whereby, among other things, the Burton Act trust and other public trust claims will be lifted from the City Donation Property in consideration for the conveyance of such land and certain Catellus-owned property, free of the trust, to The Regents (a copy of the Amended ACPT is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. \_\_\_98-1435 \_\_\_); and,

•	WHENEAS, I distant to companion board of Supervisors Ordinance
2	Nos. 331-98 and 330-98, the City intends to enter into amendments and
3	restatements of the Mission Bay Port Land Transfer Agreement (the "Amended PLTA") and
4	the Mission Bay City Land Transfer Agreement (the "Amended CLTA") with Catellus, which
5	agreements will facilitate the donation of the Campus Site to The Regents (copies of the
6	Amended PLTA and the Amended CLTA are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors
7	under File Nos. 98-1435 and 98-1435 respectively); and,
8	WHEREAS, A copy of the proposed City Donation Agreement, containing the terms
9	and conditions of the contribution of the City Donation Property to The Regents, is on file with
10	the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 98-1435 (the "City Donation
11	Agreement"); and,
12	WHEREAS, Catellus will contribute the remaining land within the Campus Site to The
13	Regents in two main parts under the terms and conditions of separate agreements between
14	Catellus and The Regents; and,
15	WHEREAS, The proposed City Donation Agreement similarly provides for the
16	conveyance of the City Donation Agreement in two main parts, to close concurrently with the
17	closings of the contribution of the Catellus-owned property; and,
18	WHEREAS, The City Donation Agreement will supersede and replace the existing
19	agreement between the City and The Regents regarding the donation of the 1.34 acres of
20	City property described above, if the closing of the donation of block 24 to The Regents has
21	not occurred by the time of the closing of the first of the two conveyances under the City
22	Donation Agreement; and,
23	WHEREAS, Within the Campus Site, The Regents have committed to making available
24	approximately 8 acres of public open space and an approximately 2.2-acre site for
25	construction of an elementary, middle or secondary school to be operated by the

San Francisco Unified School District, or, if the School District chooses not to build and
operate a school at such location, The Regents will provide additional publicly accessible
open space in an amount and location in the Campus Site as further provided in the City
Donation Agreement; and,
WHEREAS, On September 17, 1998, the City Planning Commission, by Motion
No, and the Redevelopment Agency Commission, by Resolution
No, certified the Final Subsequent Environmental Impact Report for the
Mission Bay Project ("Final SEIR") as accurate, adequate and objective and in compliance
with the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"), which certification was affirmed by
the Board of Supervisors by Motion No; and,
WHEREAS, This Board of Supervisors has reviewed and considered the information
contained in the Final SEIR; and,
WHEREAS, For purposes of compliance with CEQA, the Donation Agreement is part
of the Mission Bay project examined in the Final SEIR for which the Board of Supervisors, by
Resolution No, has adopted findings with respect to the Final SEIR as
required by CEQA, which findings are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors under
File No; and,
WHEREAS, By Planning Commission Resolution No. 14699, adopted on
September 17, 1998, the Planning Commission found that the City Donation Agreement is
consistent with the City's General Plan, as amended, and with the eight Priority Policies of
City Planning Code Section 101.1, and a copy of such resolution is on file with the Clerk of
the Board of Supervisors in File No. 981434; now, therefore, be it
RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby adopts and incorporates the
findings under CEQA contained in Resolution No. 854-98 by reference as though
such findings were fully set forth in this resolution; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby approves the City Donation Agreement in the form presented to this Board, and specifically approves the conveyance of the City Donation Property to The Regents, at no transfer price and on an "as is" basis, for the purpose of facilitating the development of the property for university purposes, as contemplated by the City Donation Agreement; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors finds that the City Donation Agreement, and the contribution of City Donation Property on the terms contemplated thereby, is necessary for the development of the UCSF Campus, is in the best interests of the City and County, and will further a public purpose; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That to ensure that the City Donation Property will serve a public purpose, the conveyance of the City Donation Property shall be subject to a deed restriction prohibiting use of the City Donation Property for any purposes other than those which are predominantly non-profit and directly support, benefit or further the charitable, scientific research, educational and public service purposes of UCSF, as reflected by existing uses on other campuses within The University of California system, and, in addition, the conveyance of the City Donation Property shall be subject to provisions requiring that The Regents re-convey the undeveloped portion of such property or pay the City for the fair market value of such land if The Regents develop 500,000 square feet or more of gross building area in a single geographic location other than the Campus Site prior to having commenced construction of at least 1,000,000 square feet of gross building area on the Campus Site, all as provided in the City Donation Agreement; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby finds that the conveyance of the City Donation Property under the City Donation Agreement is consistent with the General Plan, as amended, and with the eight Priority Policies of Planning Code Section 101.1 for the same reasons as set forth in Planning Commission Resolution

No.  $\underline{14699}$ , and hereby incorporates such findings by reference as though fully set forth in this resolution; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this Board of Supervisors authorizes and urges the Mayor, the Director of Property and the Executive Director of the Port to execute the City Donation Agreement, in the name and on behalf of the City and County, in substantially the form of such agreement presented to this Board of Supervisors; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes the Mayor, the Director of Property and the Executive Director of the Port to enter into any additions, amendments or other modifications to the City Donation Agreement (including, without limitation, the exhibits) that they determine, in consultation with the City Attorney, are in the best interests of the City, do not materially increase the obligations or liabilities of the City, will not have any material adverse fiscal impact on the City and do not materially diminish the rights of the City, and are necessary or advisable to complete the transaction contemplated in the City Donation Agreement and effectuate the purpose and intent of this resolution, such determination to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery by the Mayor, the Director of Property and the Executive Director of the Port of the City Donation Agreement and any amendments thereto; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors authorizes and urges the Mayor, the Director of Property, the Executive Director of the Port and any other officers, agents or employees of the City to take any and all steps (including, but not limited to, the execution and delivery of any and all deeds, escrow instructions, agreements, notices, consents and other instruments or documents) as they or any of them deem necessary or appropriate, in consultation with the City Attorney, in order to consummate the City Donation Agreement in accordance with this resolution, or to otherwise effectuate the purpose and intent of this resolution, such determination to be conclusively evidenced by the execution

1	and delivery by such person or persons of any such documents; and, be it
2	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the approval under this resolution shall take effect upon
3	the effective date of the amendments to the General Plan approved under Board of
4	Supervisors Ordinance No. 324-98, adopted on October 30, 1998.
