CONCURRING/WITH THE CONTROLLER'S CERTIFICATION THAT ASSISTANCE TO CERTAIN VICTIMS OF CRIME AND EDUCATION IN COMMUNITY ANTI-STREET VIOLENCE CAN BE PRACTICALLY PERFORMED FOR THE DISTRICT ATTORNEY'S VICTIM WITNESS ASSISTANCE PROGRAM BY A PRIVATE CONTRACT FOR A LOWER COST THAN SIMILAR WORK SERVICES PERFORMED BY CITY AND COUNTY EMPLOYEES

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Community United Against Violence has established and will maintain networks of persons to safeguard neighborhoods, conduct workshops on personal safety, selfdefense and property protection including, but not limited to, providing a domestic violence housing specialist to handle the transitional housing to assist victims to obtain new permanent households and, under the direction of the Victim Witness Assistance Program, helps victims and witnesses to cooperate with the criminal justice system in prosecution of the guilty and alleviation of their own injuries, and

WHEREAS, the electorate of the City and County of San Francisco passed Proposition J in November 1976 adding Section 8.300-1 to the Charter allowing City Departments to contract with private companies for specific services, which can be practically performed for a lower cost than similar work by City and County employees, and

WHEREAS, the Office of the District Attorney has sought and received estimates from private contractors and wishes to contract for these services, and the Controller has certified on <u>December 21, 2000</u>

Mayor Supervisor Newsom that said services could be performed at a lower cost in the City and County by a private contractor than by employees of the City and County; now, retroactively.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors hereby concurs/ with the Controller's Certification and approves and authorizes the Office of the District Attorney to contract for the services of the Community United Against Violence, effective July 1/ 2000.
