[Rapid Test Algorithm in Non-Traditional Test Sites to Improve Linkage to Care]

Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (DPH), AIDS Office – HIV Prevention Section to accept and expend retroactively a new grant in the total amount of \$242,573, from the Department of Health and Human Services, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in support of a program entitled Rapid Test Algorithm in Non-Traditional Test Sites to Improve Linkage to Care, for the period of September 30, 2006 through September 29, 2007.

WHEREAS, DPH, AIDS Office has been awarded a new grant from the CDC for \$242,573 in Year 1 and, subject to the availability of funds and satisfactory progress of the project, \$214,256 in Year 2, with a total of \$456,829 to support HIV testing in non-traditional sites; and,

WHEREAS, DPH, AIDS Office will collaborate closely with the subcontractor. Public Health Foundation Enterprises (PHFE) Management Solutions who will provide fiscal intermediary support for the HIV Prevention staff to coordinate the project services; and,

WHEREAS, The long-term objectives of this research project are to a) increase the number of HIV-infected individuals who learn their status and enter into treatment, b) reduce the burden of rapid HIV testing implementation and maintenance on the staff of performance sites, and c) improve the efficiency and quality of HIV testing services available for high-risk and hard to reach clientele; and,

WHEREAS, the grant does not require an ASO amendment and reimburses the department for an existing Health Program Coordinator II position (Job Class 2591) at 0.50 FTE from December 1, 2006 through September 29, 2007; and

WHEREAS, The grant budget includes a provision for indirect costs of \$7,820 in Year 1; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That SFDPH, AIDS Office, is hereby authorized to accept and expend retroactively a new grant in the amount of \$242,573 from the CDC; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to retroactively accept and expend the grant funds in accordance with the requirements set forth in the Agreement, pursuant to San Francisco Administrative Code section 10.170-1; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate all positions funded under this agreement as "G" or grant-funded positions which would terminate when the agreement expires.
