Gwendolyn Ann Smith (residency requirement waived), succeeding Theresa Sparks, resigned, seat 2, must be a member of the transgender community; for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending June 1, 2002;

Felicia Elizondo, succeeding Riley Morgan, resigned, seat 5, must be a member of the transgender community; for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending June 1, 2002; Simon Aronoff (residency requirement waived), succeeding David Strachan, resigned, seat 6, must be a member of the transgender community; for the unexpired portion of a two-year term ending June 1, 2002; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 1. The membership of the Transgender Civil Rights Implementation Task Force has a goal to be representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- Applicants Gwendolyn Ann Smith and Simon Aronoff, new appointees, who are not resident of San Francisco, are persons with experience that uniquely qualifies him/her to serve on the Transgender Civil Rights Implementation Task Force.

- 3. The Transgender Civil Rights Implementation Task Force has attempted to fill the position, for which Gwendolyn Ann Smith and Simon Aronoff were nominated, with individuals who are City residents and who have the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Gwendolyn Ann Smith and Simon Aronoff are qualified to serve on the Transgender Civil Rights Implementation Task Force.
- 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there are no other possible representative, who are residents of San Francisco and who have the specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by these applicants, and who are willing to serve on the Transgender Civil Rights Implementation Task Force at this time; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement for Gwendolyn Ann Smith and Simon Aronoff, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires person(s) appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
