[Accept and Expend State Grant – Funding two Environmental Health programs.]

Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (DPH) to accept and expend retroactively a new grant in the amount of \$8,250 from the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) funding two programs, the Petroleum Products Compliance program and the Weighmaster Enforcement Program; for the period of July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

WHEREAS, DPH was awarded a grant totaling \$8,250 from the CDFA combining awards to support two programs, the Petroleum Products Compliance program (\$6,900) and the Weighmaster Enforcement Program (\$1,350) for the period of July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009; and,

WHEREAS, The goal of the Petroleum Products Compliance program is to ensure minimum quality standards for most petroleum and automotive products and the goal of the Weighmaster Enforcement Program (\$1,125) is to ensure that weighing devices function properly and accurately, safeguarding consumer purchases; and,

WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the grant funds, the CDFA requires the City to comply with the terms of an agreement (the "Agreement"), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 081207, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as if set forth fully herein; and,

WHEREAS, An ASO amendment is not required for this grant, as the funds will be used for a small portion of the following existing positions within DPH, two Inspectors of Weights and Measures (Job Class 6220), at .10 FTE; and,

WHEREAS, The grant terms prohibit including indirect costs in the grant budget; and,

WHEREAS, Retroactive approval is being sought because while DPH received the contract on May 30, 2008, the CDFA subsequently suspended the contract due to problems with the State's FY 2008-09 budget, and only released the suspension in early August; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That DPH is hereby authorized to accept and expend retroactively a grant in the amount of \$8,250 from the CDFA; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Controller is directed to designate all positions funded under this agreement as "G" or grant-funded positions which would terminate when the agreement expires; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby waives inclusion of indirect costs in the budget of the Agreement; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the agreement on behalf of the City.
