Resolution urging the United States Congress to save the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP), restore the thousands of people cut from CSFP since 2003, and expand the program to meet the increasing need.

WHEREAS, The San Francisco Food Bank administers the CSFP program and provides a monthly food box from the United States Department of Agriculture to 9,600 people in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, The program serves a majority of low-income seniors in San Francisco; and

WHEREAS, Every food box is filled with nutritious foods seniors need to maintain their health, like canned tuna or chicken, cheese, rice, cereal, fruits and vegetables; and

WHEREAS, since 2004, 2,400 low-income seniors in San Francisco have been cut from the program as the United States Department of Agriculture has increased the cost of the food and Congress has not provided enough funding to meet the need; and

WHEREAS, Participants in the program must have a monthly income below \$1,126 to qualify for CSFP; and

WHEREAS, The CSFP program is cost-effective, with the food box valued at \$50 yet costing the United States Department of Agriculture less than \$19 per box; and

WHEREAS, CSFP is the only\_federal commodity program that provides participants with a nutritionally balanced food source each month; and

WHEREAS, The Bush Administration has proposed to eliminate the program in the coming fiscal year; and

WHEREAS, This program helped feed almost 500,000 low income seniors each month last year across the country and more than 53,000 seniors per month in California,, and

WHEREAS, almost 600,000 low-income California seniors are eligible with more than 27,000 San Francisco seniors in need.

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors urges the United States Congress to restore full funding of \$175 million to the Commodity Supplemental Food Program.
